Big Ben



Big Ben is the nickname for the great bell of the clock in the clock tower of the Palace of Westminster. The nickname is often also used to refer to the clock and the tower.

The clock is the world's largest four-faced, chiming clock and the third largest free-standing clock tower in the world¹. The clock tower is situated at the north-eastern end of the Houses of Parliament in Westminster, London. The Big Ben clock tower has been referred to incorrectly as *St Stephen's Tower*, which is a low tower above St Stephen's Entrance.



Buckingham palace

Besides being the official London residence of The Queen, Buckingham Palace is also the busy administrative headquarters of the monarchy and has probably the most famous and easily recognizable façade of any building in the world.

A double-decker bus



A bus with two passenger decks. Double-deckers are common sight in Britain. London has more than 3,000 double-deckers. In their original form they were «hop on, hop off» buses. That is, there were on doors. There was a conductor who collected fares. Most double-deckers these days have doors and conductor. Fares are paid to the driver. At many seaside resorts, double-deckers with an open top deck are used in the summer season for tourists who are sightseeing.

The Underground has more than 280 stations and around 400 km (250 miles) of track, making it the longest metro system in the world by route length. It also has one of the highest number of stations. In 2007, more than one billion passenger journeys were recorded, making it the third busiest metro system in Europe after Paris and Moscow.
