




# Montmartre





*Montmartre is a hill which is 130 meters high, giving its name to the surrounding district, in the north of Paris. Montmartre is primarily known for the white-domed Basilica of the Sacré Cœur*



- In Gallo-Roman era on the hill there were built two temples in honor of the gods Mars and Mercury.
- The quarry for production of a gypsum, served as a refuge for early Christians.
- In the Middle Ages, Montmartre was a place of pilgrimage of the faithful.

- With the deposit of gypsum of Montmartre was one of the richest areas in the county.
- The XII century is the beginning of construction of windmills for grinding gypsum and landing of vineyards.





- Here lived and worked Renoir, Van Gogh, Toulouse-Lautrec, Utrillo, Apollinaire, the customs Rousseau later - Picasso, Braque, Modigliani.
- Favorite meeting place for Parisian bohemians were bars and cabarets, such as "Black Cat", "Moulin Rouge" and "Agile Rabbit".


• Everyone knows that Pissarro painted views from the windows.

- look at cabaret "Moulin Rouge"






- visit the café “Les Deux Moulins” (Rue Lepic)

- visit Basilica of the Sacré Cœur





