

- Whether a name has the depends on the kind of place it is.
  - Brook Street, the North Sea
- Most place names do not have the.
  Europe, England, London
- Some place names have the.
  - the Classic Cinema, the Thames

### Continents, countries, islands, states, counties

- Most are without the.
  - Africa, France, Rhode Island, Florida, Sussex
- Words like republic and kingdom have the.
  - the Republic of Ireland, the United Kingdom
- Plural names also have the.
  - the USR, the Canary Islands





#### Regions

- Regions ending with the name of a continent or country are without the.
  - Central Asia, South Wales
- Most other regions have the.
  - the West, the Riviera, the Highlands
- Phrases with of have the.
  - the South of France, the Tower of London



#### **Hills and mountains**

- Most are without the.
  - Mount Everest, North Hill
- Hill ranges and mountain ranges have the.
  - the Alps, the Rockies



## Lakes, oceans, seas, rivers and canals

- Only lakes are without the.
  - Lake Michigan
- Seas, oceans, rivers and canals have the.
  - the Black Sea, the Atlantic Ocean, the Amazon, the Suez Canal



# Cities, towns, suburbs and villages

- More are without the.
  - New York, Edinburgh
    Harehills is a suburb of Leeds
- Exceptions are : The Hague and The Bronx
- Note also : the West End [of London]



## Roads, streets, squares and parks

- Most are without the.
  - along Highfield Road, in Church Street on Fifth Avenue, near Trafalgar Square through Hyde Park
- Main roads and numbered roads have the.
  - the Bath road [ = the road to Bath ]
  - the Ms (motorway)





- Most are without the.
  - over Tower Bridge
  - on Brooklyn Bridge
- But there are exceptions.
  - across the Golden Gate Bridge
  - the Severn Bridge [ = the bridge over the River Severn]



### Stations and airports; important buildings

- We do not use the with most stations and airports; with religious, educational and official buildings or with palaces and houses.
  - to Waterloo Station, at Kennedy Rirport
  - St Mary's Church, Whitby Abbey
  - Cambridge University, Blair Castle, Buckingham Palace, Ashdown House



## Important buildings

- Exceptions are names with of or with a noun [science] or adjective [open].
  - at the University of York
  - in the Palace of Westminster
  - The Open University
  - The Science Museum
  - past the White House



## Theatres, cinemas, hotels, galleries and centres

- A possessive form ['s ] is without the.
  - St Martin's [Theatre]
  - at Durrant's [Hotel ]
- But usually theatres, cinemas etc. have the.
  - at the Globe [Theatre], the Plaza
  - outside the Dorchester [Hotel]
  - in the Tate (Gallery),
  - the Brunel shopping centre



#### Shops and restaurants

- Most shops and restaurants are without the.
  - shopping at Bloomingdale's
  - at Matilda's Restaurant
- Names with a noun (body, studio) often have the.
  - at the Body Shop
  - The Studio Cafe
