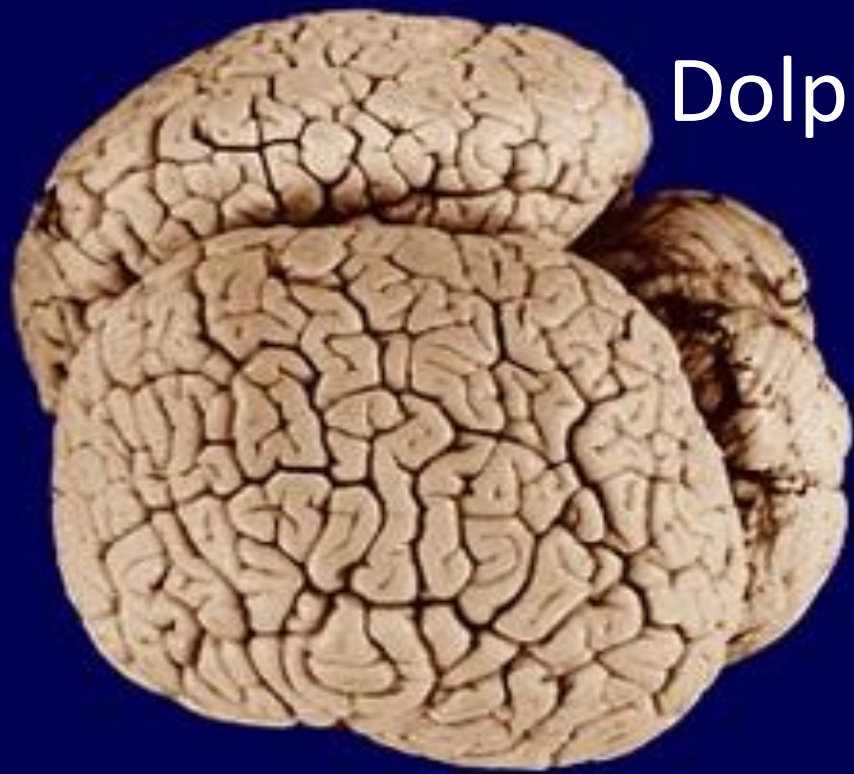


# Similarities

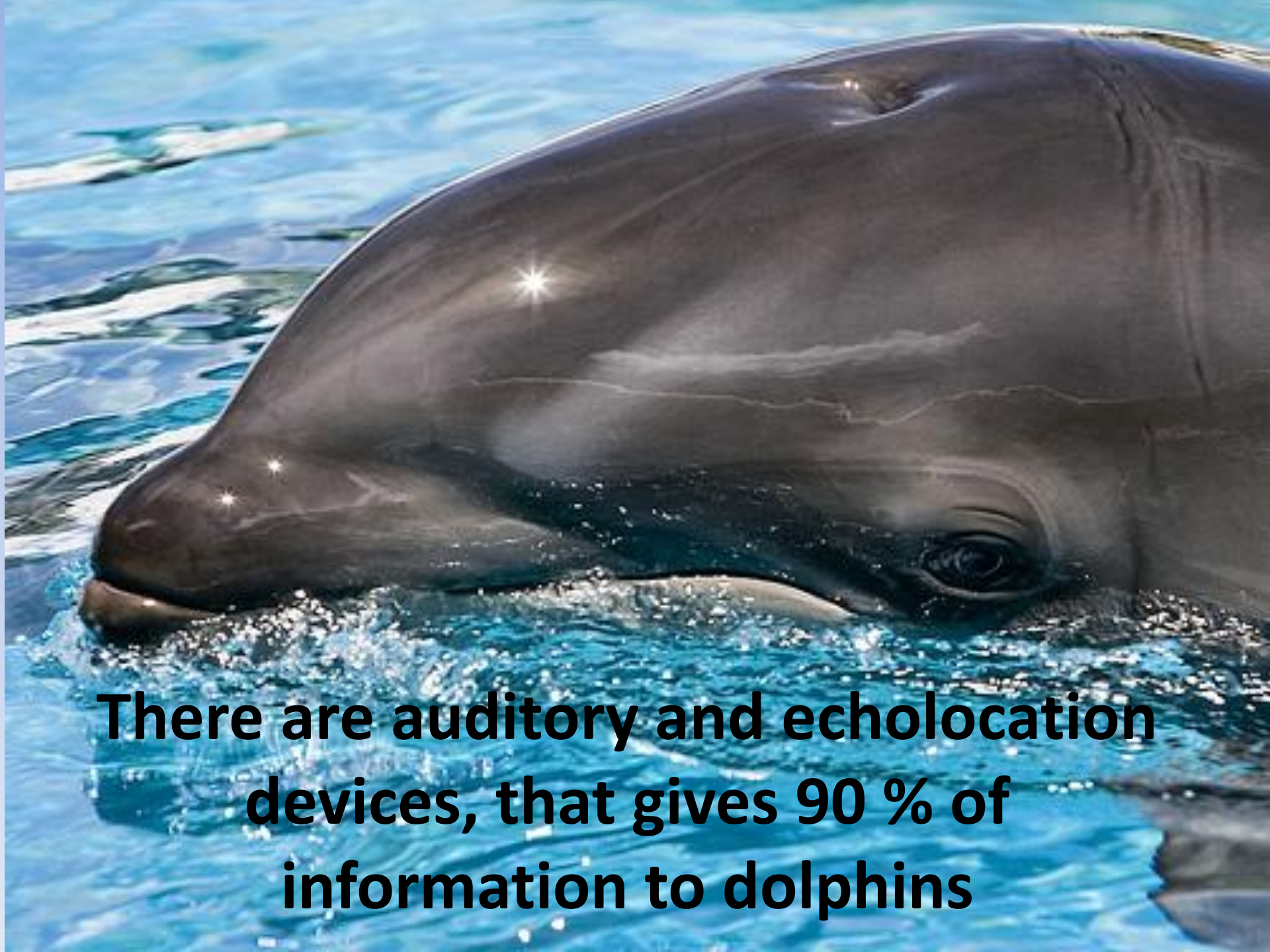

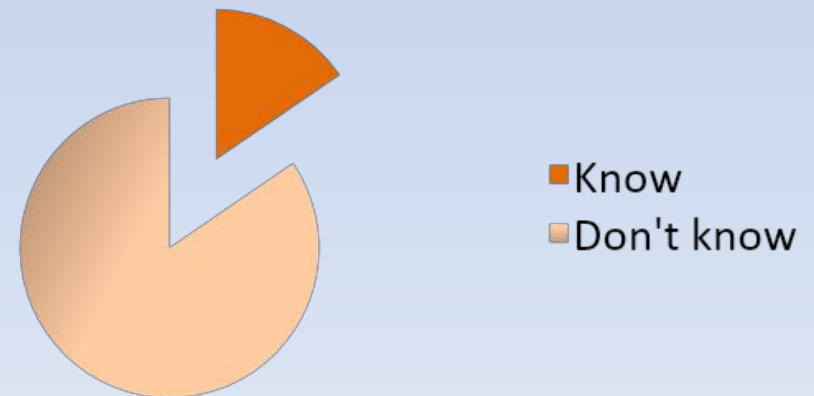

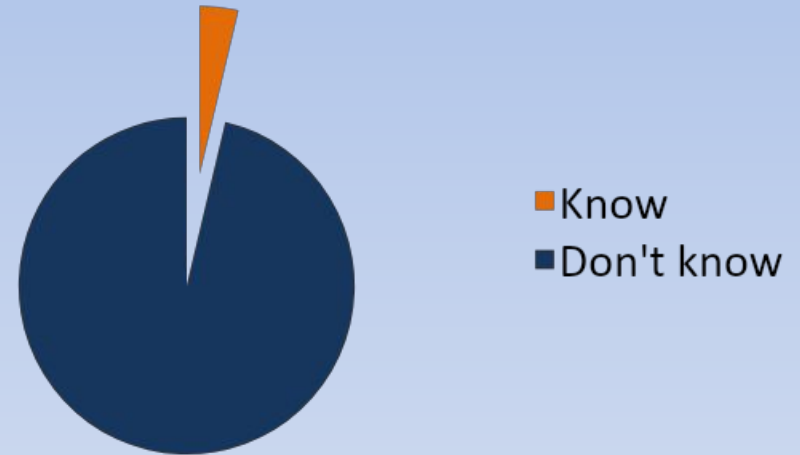
