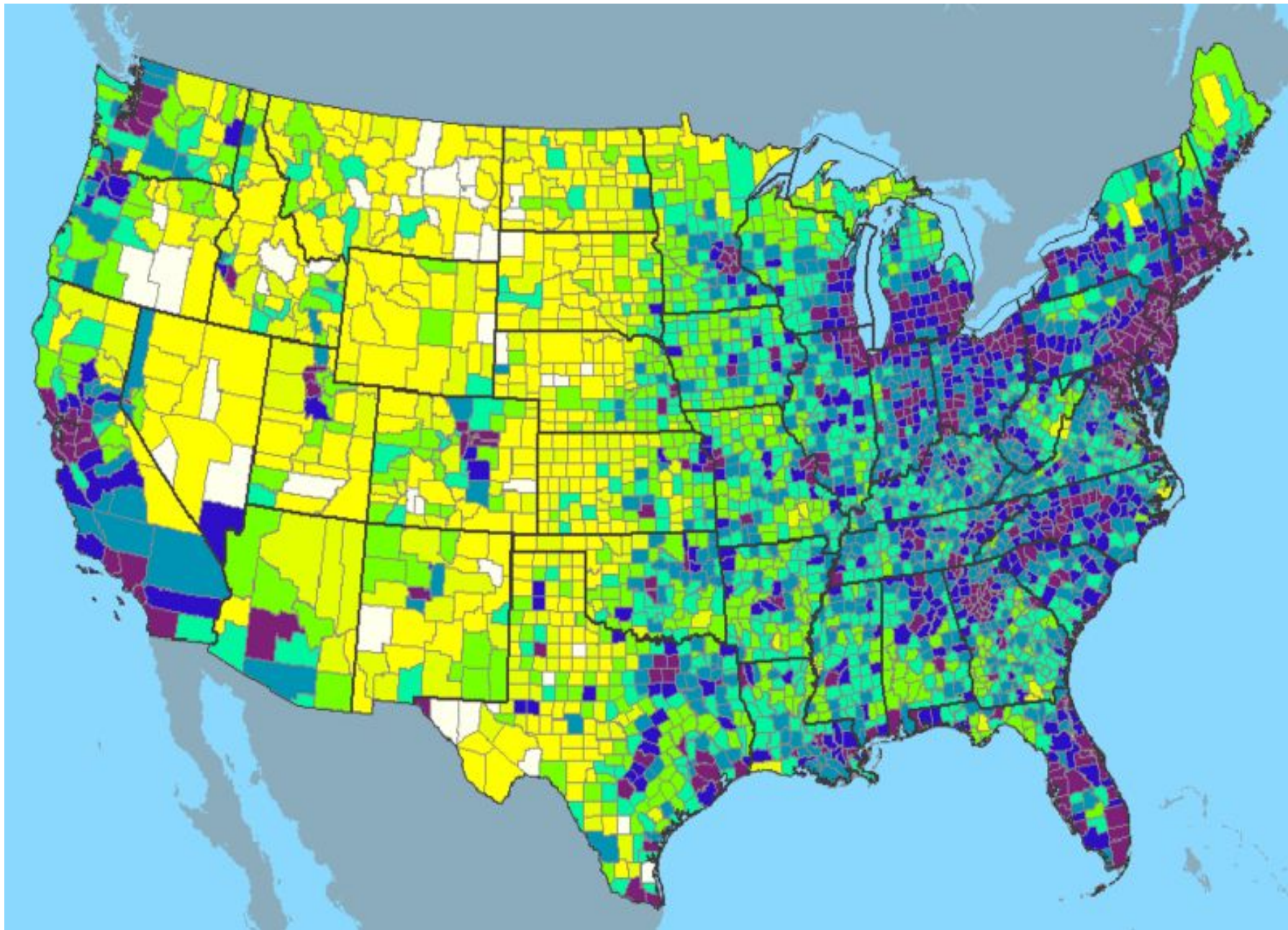

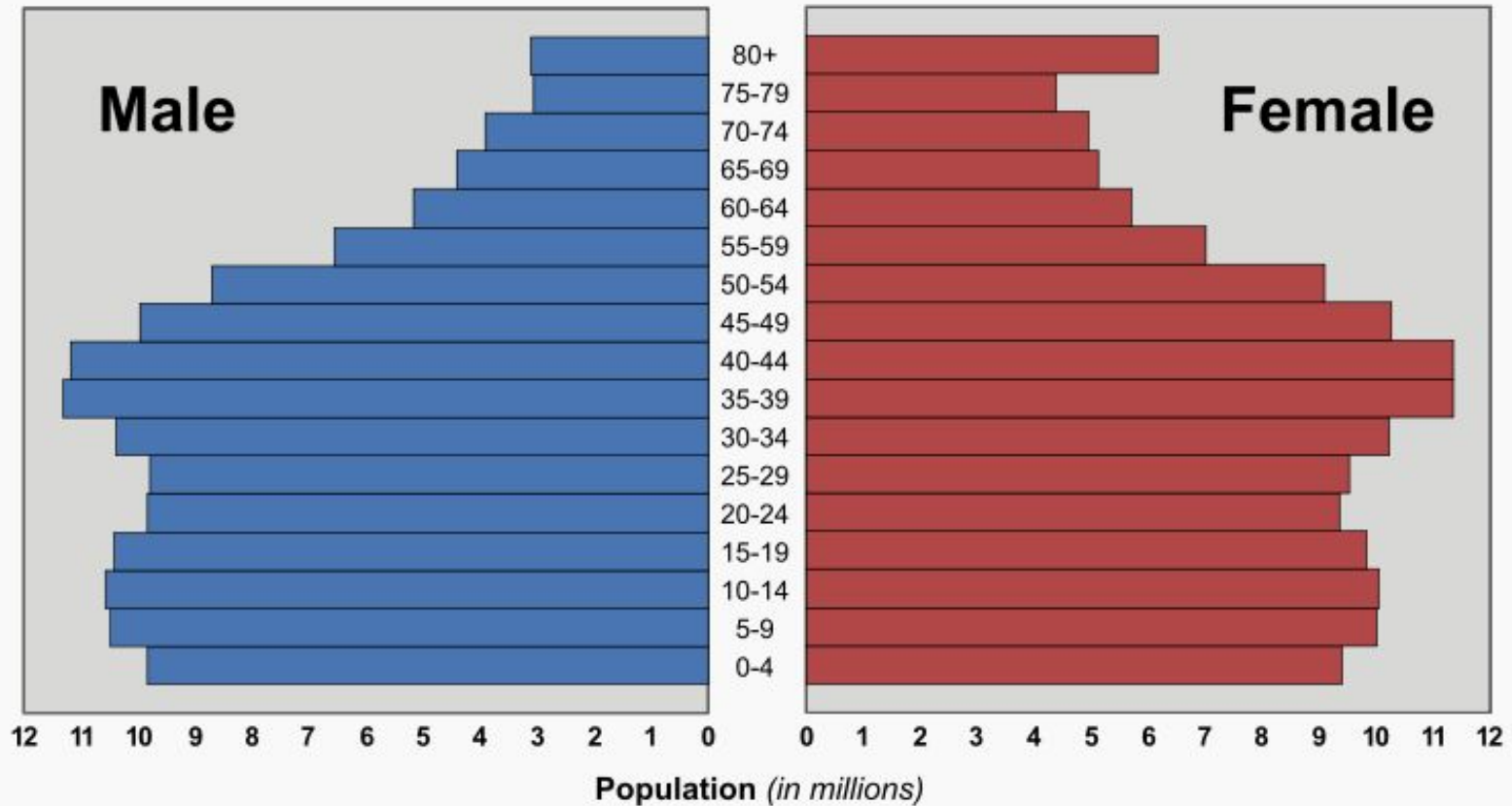

Health

- In 2010, **the average man weighed** 88.3 kg; the average woman 74.7 kg.
- A nationwide study in 2010 indicated that 19.5% of teens, aged 12–19, have developed **"slight" hearing loss**. "Slight" was defined as an inability to hear at 16 to 24 decibels.
- In 2011, an estimated **1.2 million people** were living with **HIV/AIDS** in the United States.

Other groups

There were **22.1 million veterans** in 2009.

In 2010, the Washington Post estimated that there were **11 million illegal immigrants** in the country.

There were about **2 million people in prison** in 2010.

Less than **1% of Americans currently serve** in the Armed Forces.

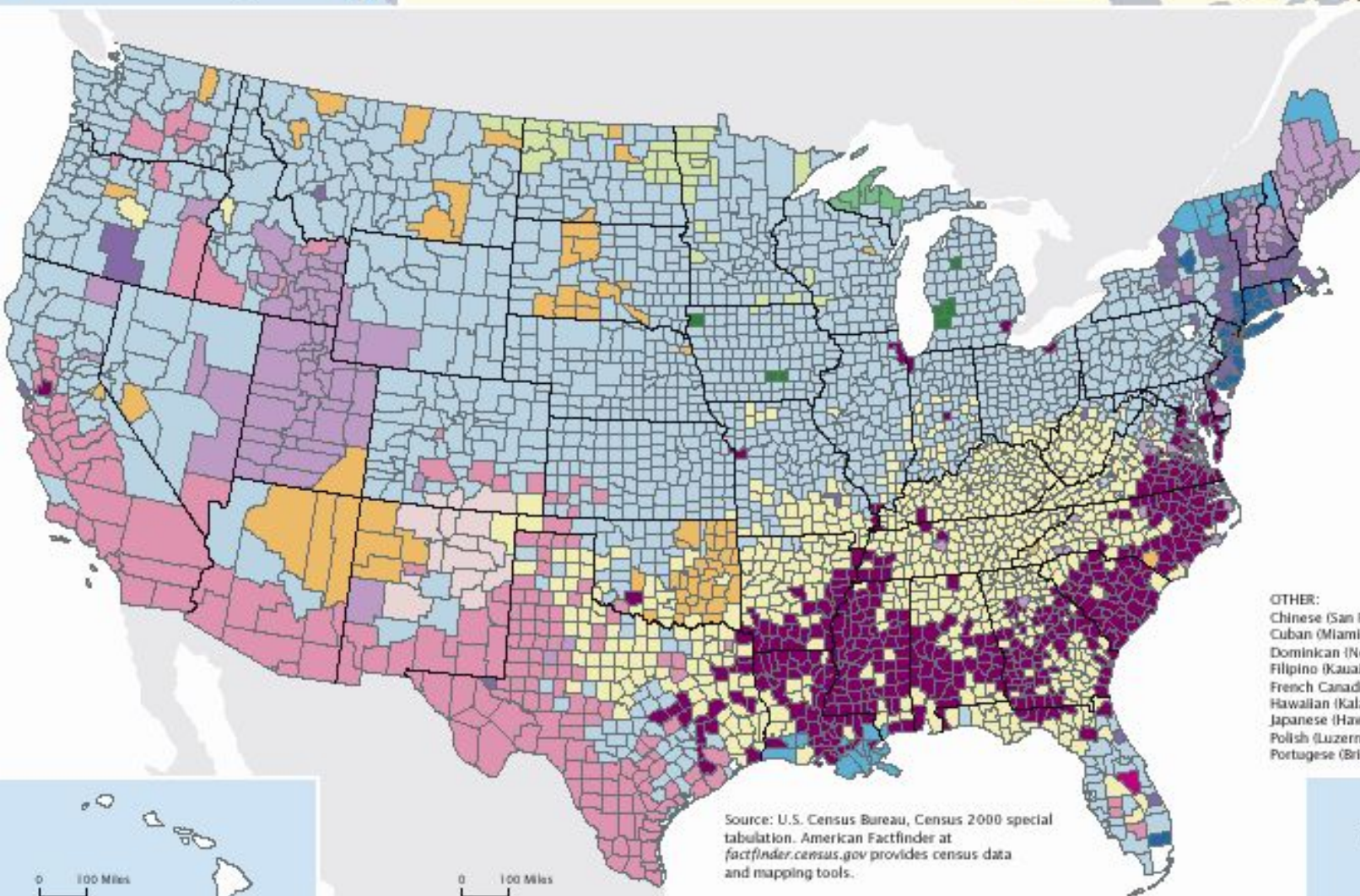
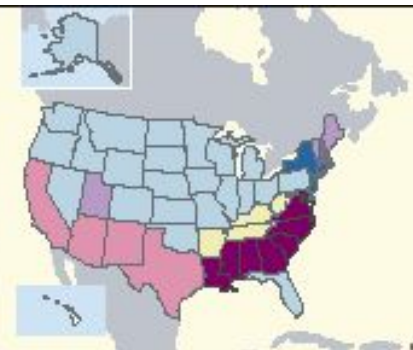
