you should definitely be aware of:

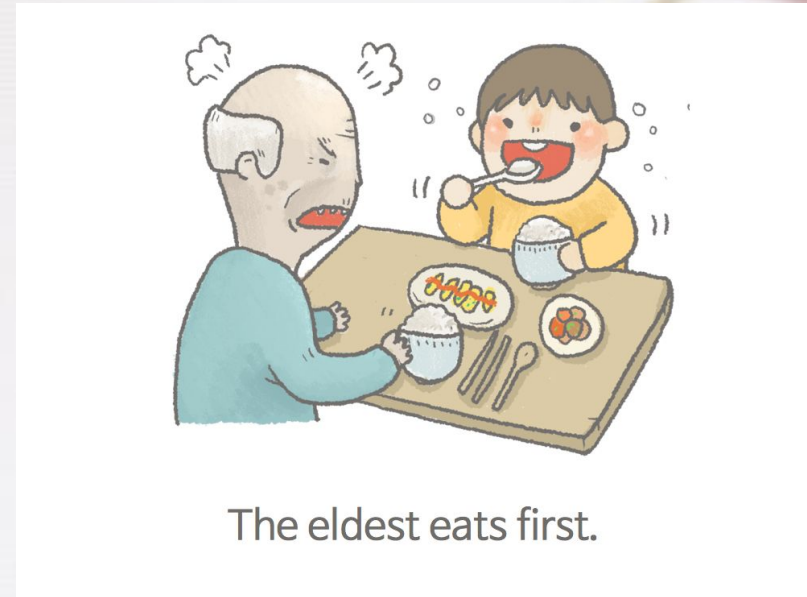
Korean Table Manner #1: Remember Rank

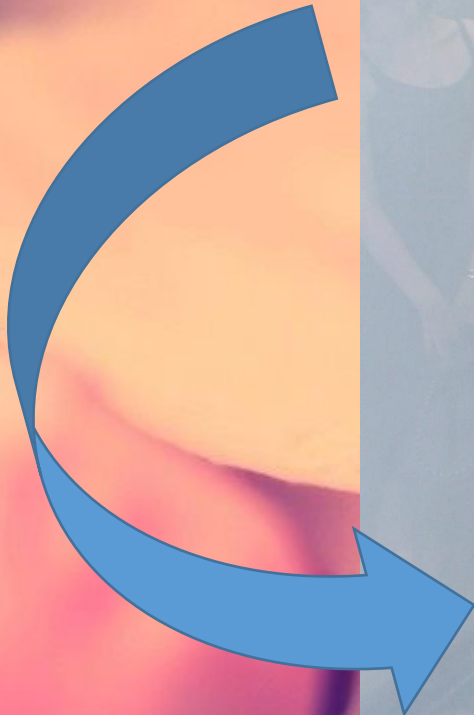
Korean Table Manner #4: No Lifting

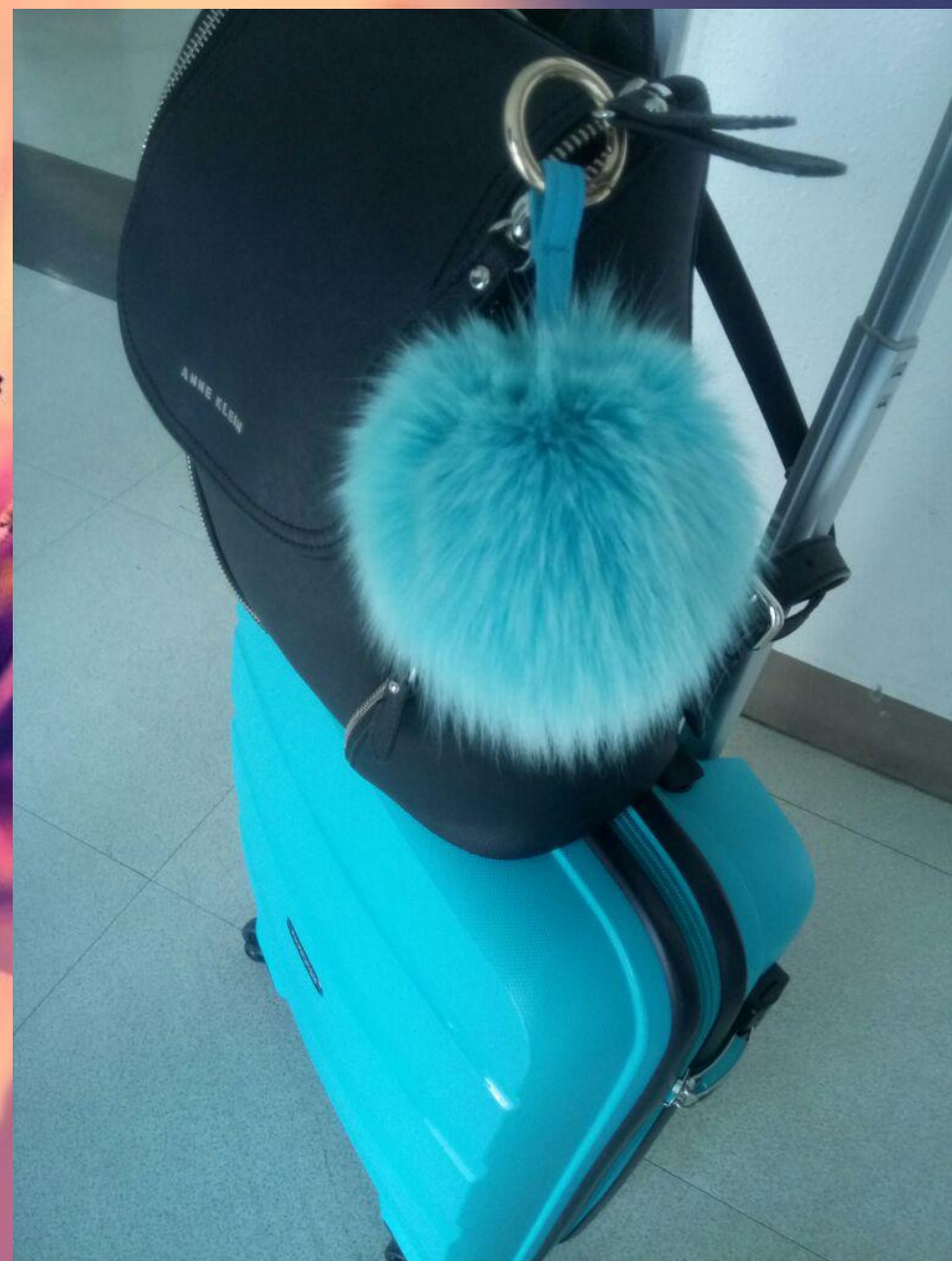
