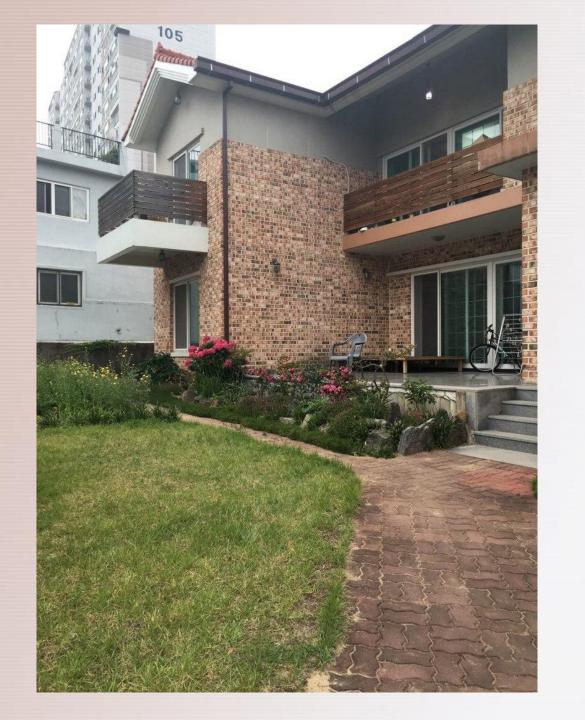

Here are some Korean table manners you should definitely be aware of:

Korean Table Manner #1: Remember Rank

The younger or lower ranked member of the group you are, the closer to the door you should sit, and only after your elders have already sat down.



Korean Table Manner #2: Oldest Eats First

Let those older than you to begin eating first before you get started on enjoying your delicious meal



Korean Table Manner #3: Tell That You Will Eat Well

Before taking your first bite, it's important to say that you will eat well.

In Korean, this is expressed with the words Jalmeokgesseumnida

(잘먹겠습니다), which in English would translate to 'I will eat well'.

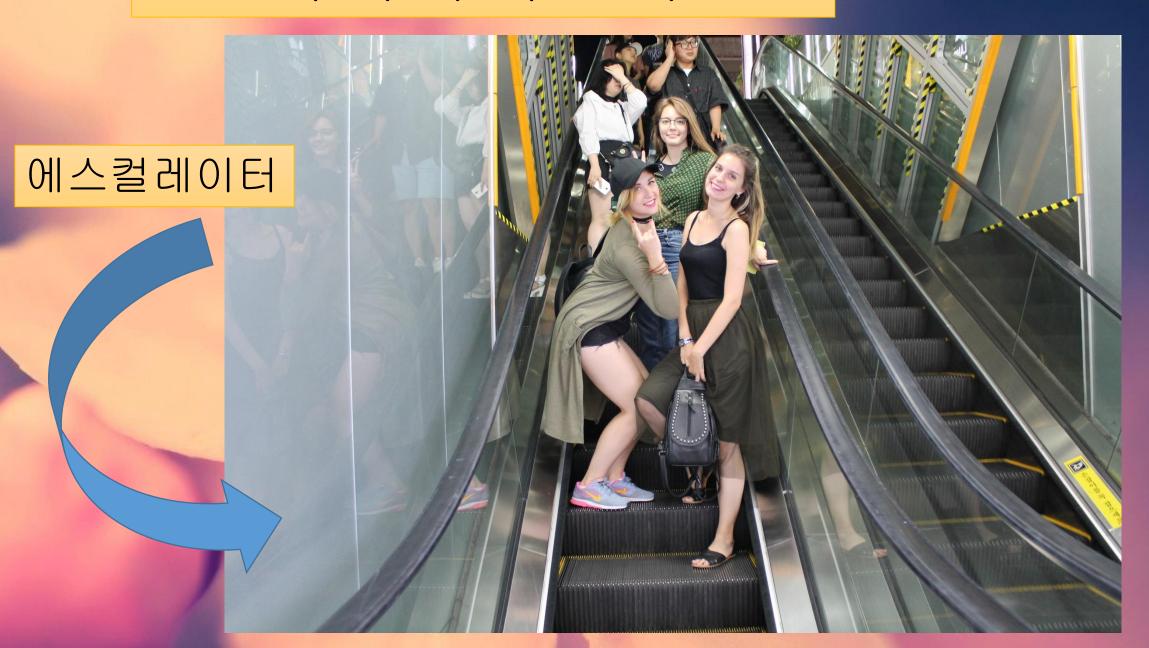
