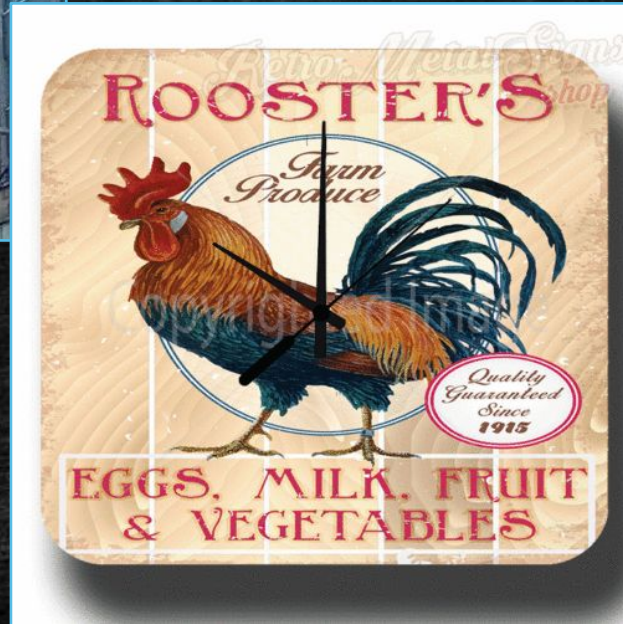

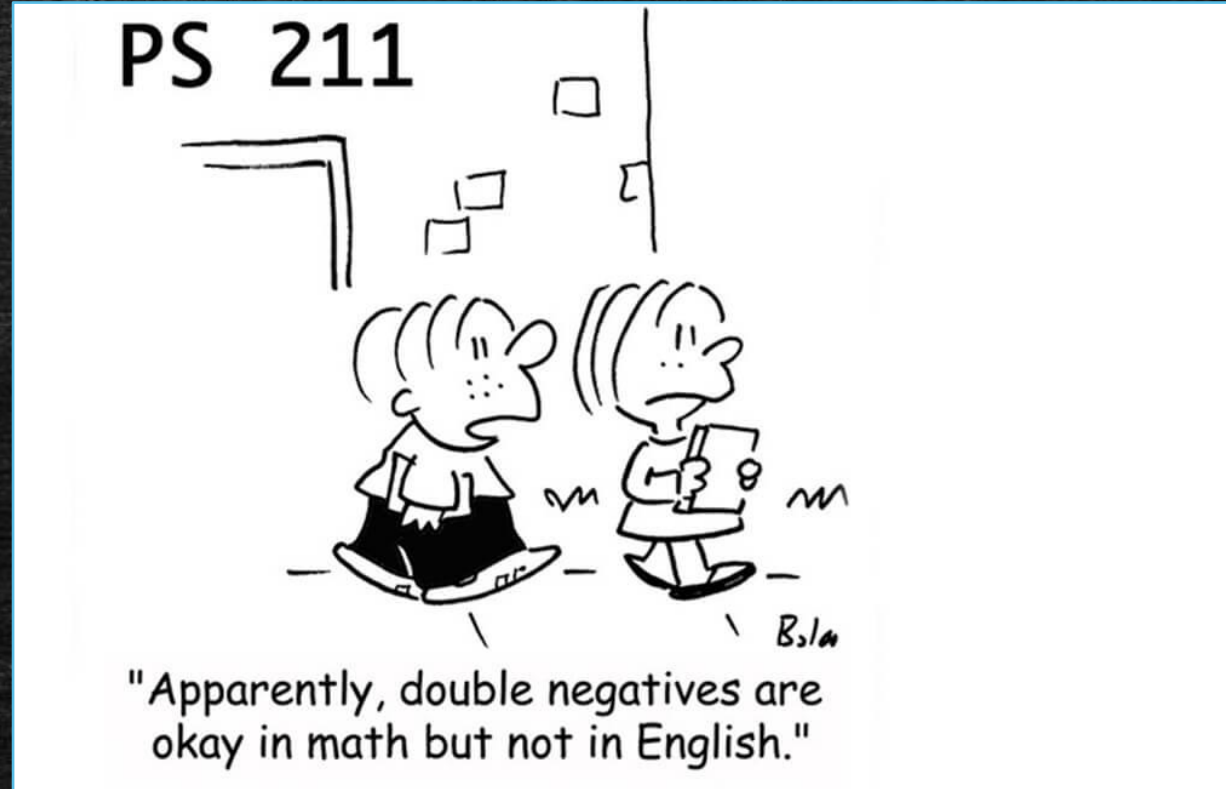
The tradition to embroider their clothes with mother-of-pearl buttons dates back to 1875.

Skip sound [h].

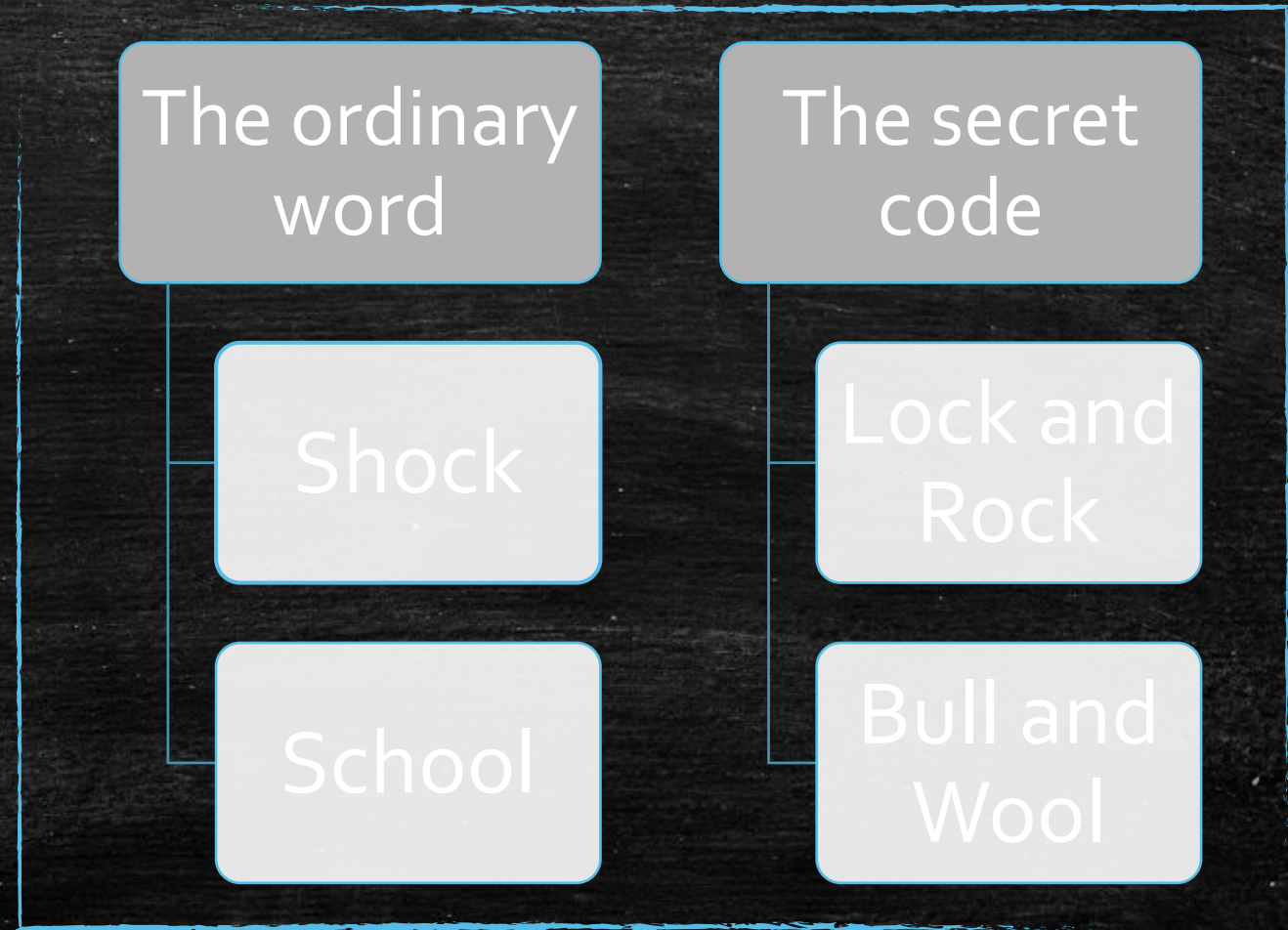
Use "ain't" instead of "isn't"

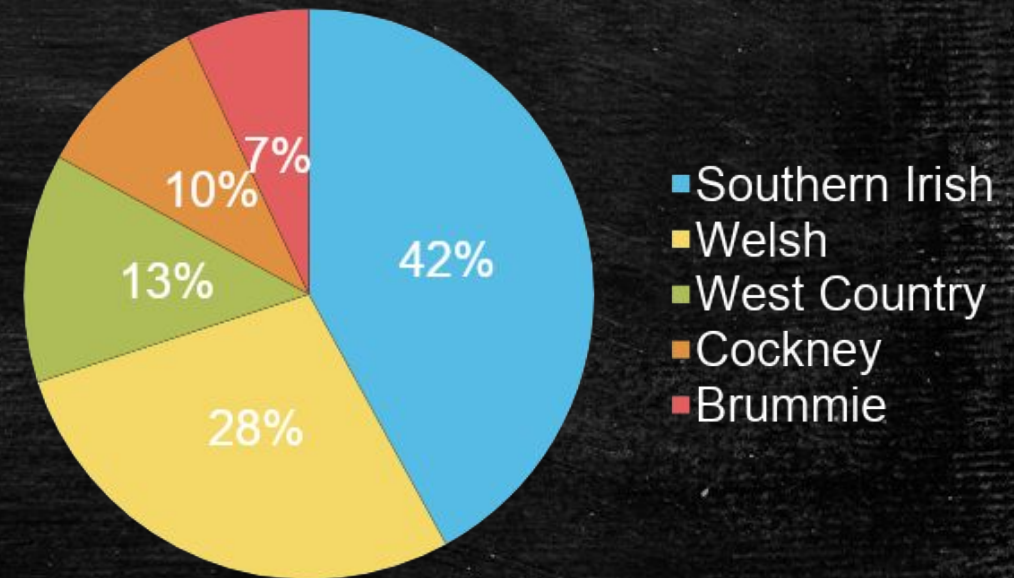
Conclusion
