- Brazil is the largest country in South America. It is characterized by beautiful nature, warm and humid climate, as well as a variety of animals. In addition to the mainland, it includes several beautiful Islands.
- The capital of Brazil is Brasilia and the biggest cities are Rio de Janeiro, Sao Paulo, Fortaleza, Salvador, Belo Horizonte.

# Climate

- Brazil crosses several climatic zones: from Equatorial to subtropical. The climate throughout is warm and humid, especially in the dense jungle.

# Population

- The national and racial composition of Brazilians is very rich. European colonists, inhabitants of Africa and Asia, as well as Indian tribes took part in its formation. The official language is Portuguese, Brazilians also speak Italian, Spanish, French, English, Japanese.

# Transport

- A large area of the country contributed to the development of air transport. Between the cities constantly run small planes, tickets for them are inexpensive. In large Metropolitan areas, wealthy residents move by helicopter. Not so rich citizens travel by bus, subway or commuter train. For tourists a taxi is preferable. Traffic jams are a problem in many Brazilian cities.

## Events

- **Carnival.** It falls on a few days in February, when the main streets of the cities are columns of participants in bright costumes. To this day I prepare special platforms and outfits in advance and think through movement and story. The largest and noisiest carnival takes place in Rio de Janeiro. To see it, the city attracts several million tourists.





- **New Year.** No less grandiose is the celebration of the New year, when most residents wear snow-white tunics and goes to the coast. Everyone makes a wish and let the offerings to the gods into the water, and then admire the beautiful fireworks.
