Westminster Abby is an attractive construction. It is interesting for visitors not only with its architectural glory but also with its rich history and cultural importance.




Westminster abbey has more historic associations than any other building in Britain. Nearly all English kings and queens have been crowned here.





The Abbey is also home to the tomb of the Unknown Soldier. It's believed that there are around 3300 people buried in the Church and Cloisters.
