- Since the Middle Ages Trafalgar Square has been a central meeting place.



# BRIGHTON

Since the Victorian era, Brighton is famous like one of the most vivid, colorful and creative cities in Europe. Its main sight, the Royal Pavilion, is among the most exotic and beautiful buildings in Britain.



# OXFORD
