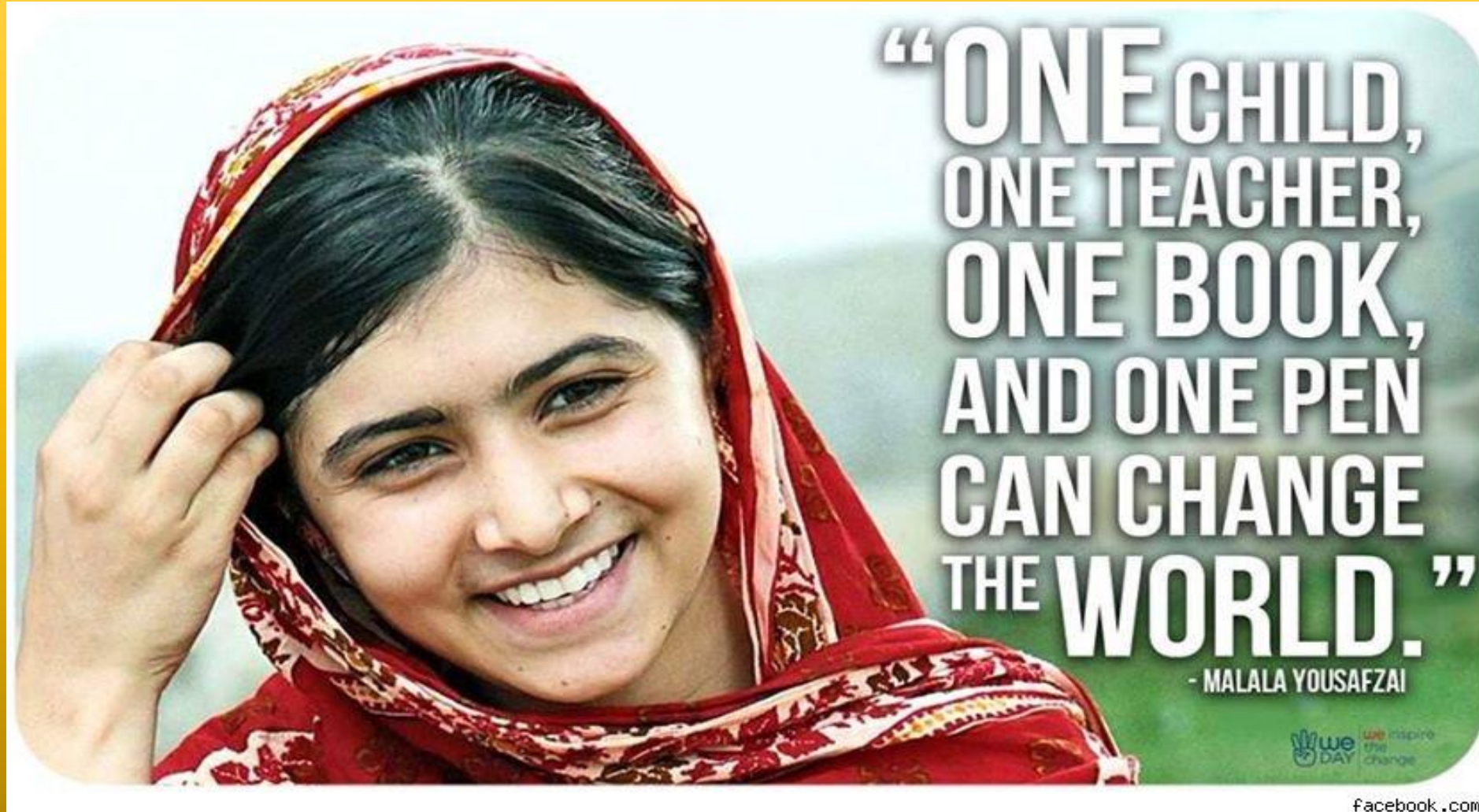
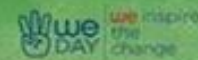

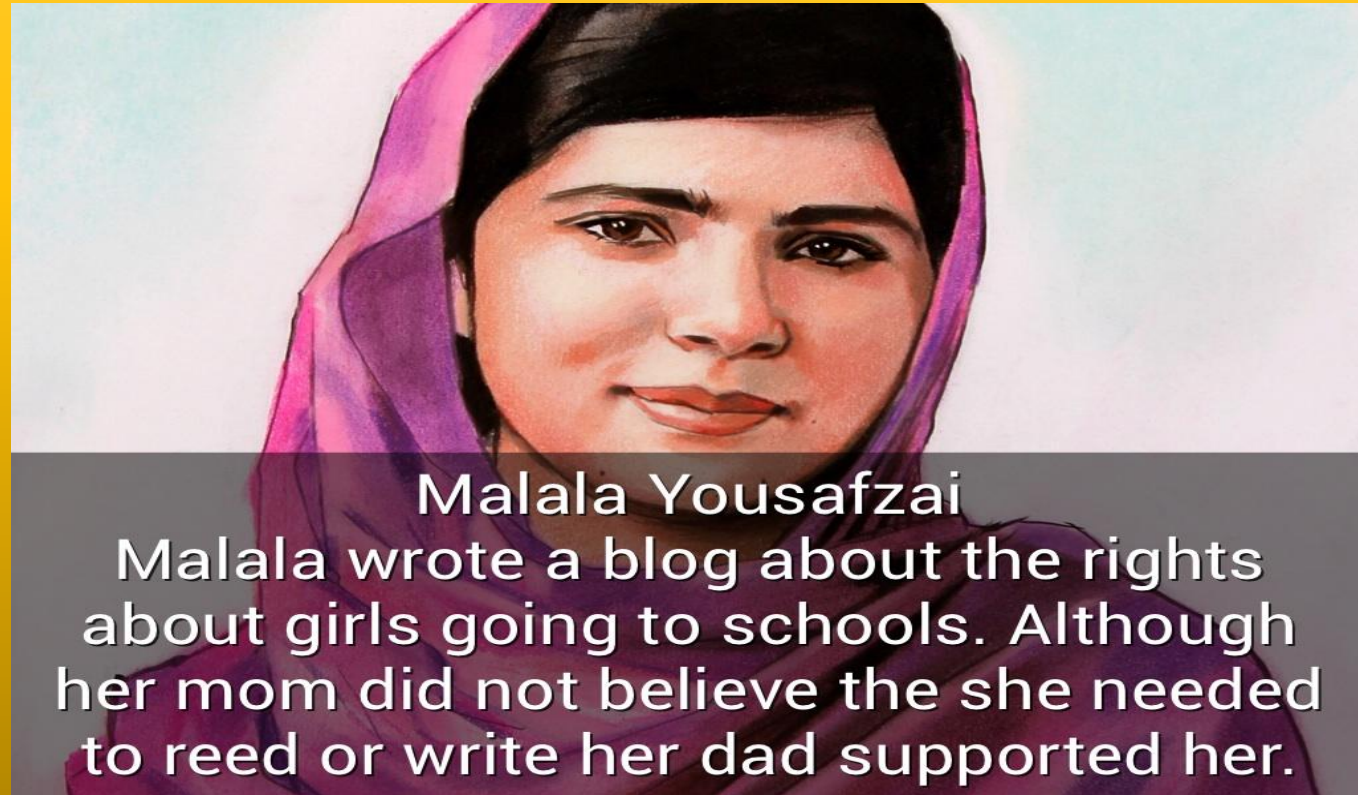

Is Pakistani activist for female education and the youngest Nobel Peace Prize. She is known mainly for human rights advocacy for education and for women in Pakistan where the local Taliban had at times banned girls from attending school.

When she was 13 she wrote a blog about her life under the Taliban rule that didn't allow education for women.

Malala wrote a blog about the rights about girls going to schools. Although her mom did not believe she needed to read or write her dad supported her.

She never stops fighting for the quality and the importance of education and unfortunately she was victim of an attack by a Taliban gunman in 2012, but she still alive fighting for the importance of education.

In 2014 she participated in the liberation of a group of Nigerian girls who were kidnapped by the Islamists who are against women's education. Malala was supported by several celebrities including President Obama.



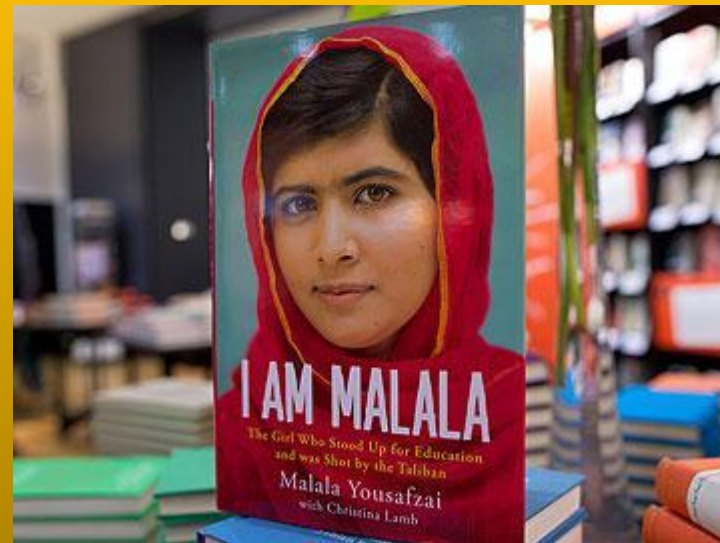
She was elected by time magazine as one of the most influential people. Pakistani Government awarded her the National Peace Award.
