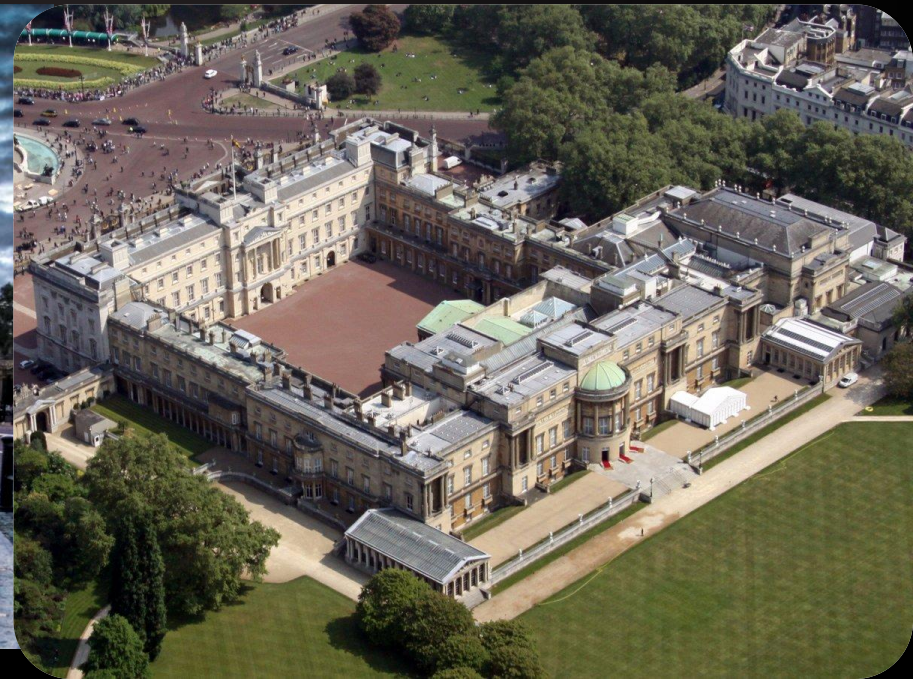
The London eye

Tower bridge is a bridge across the Thames in Central London and the main attraction of the British capital. The name of this symbol of the city comes from the nearby tower of London.



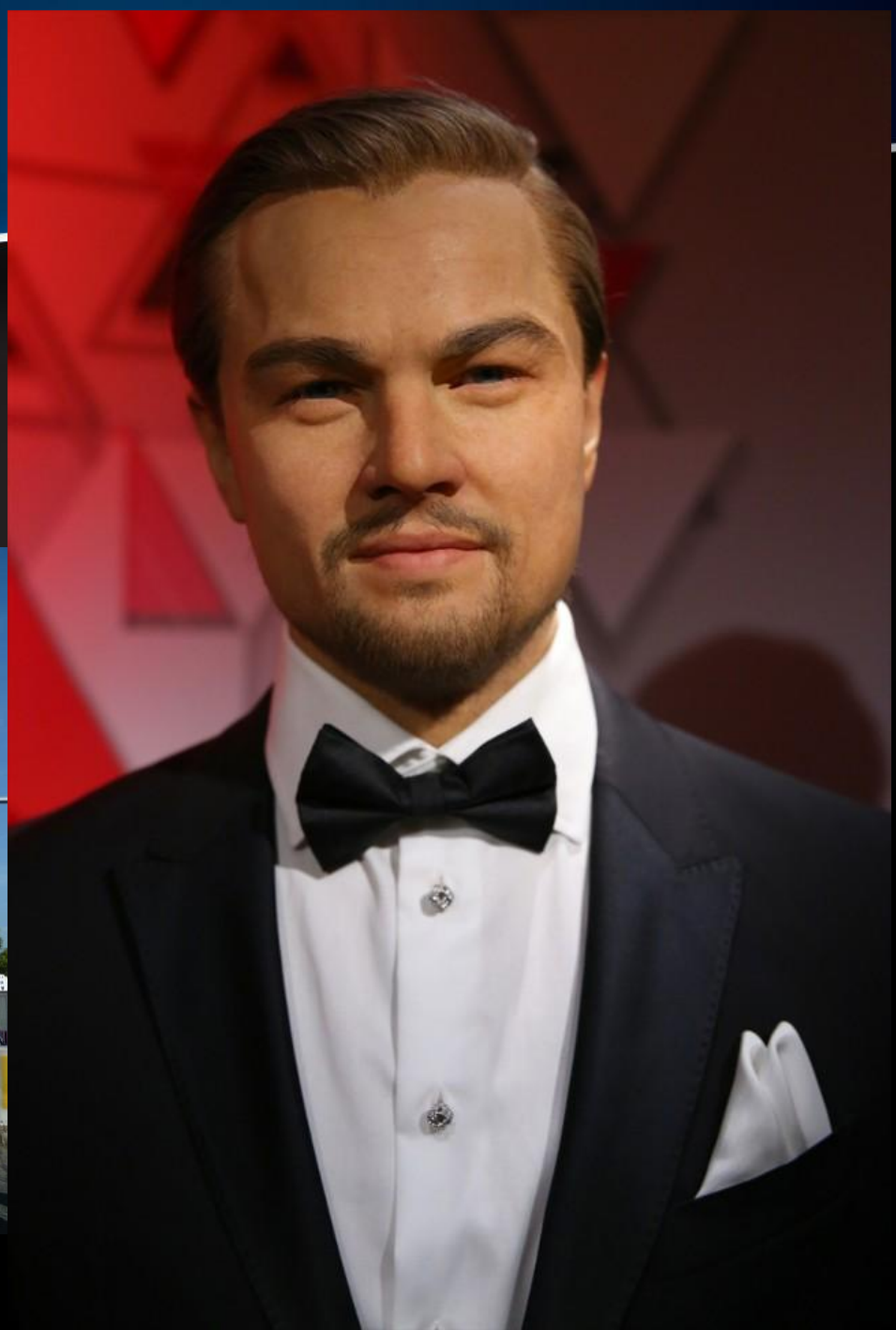
The tower of London

The tower of London is a fortress standing on the North Bank of the Thames, which is the historical center of London and one of the main symbols of Great Britain.



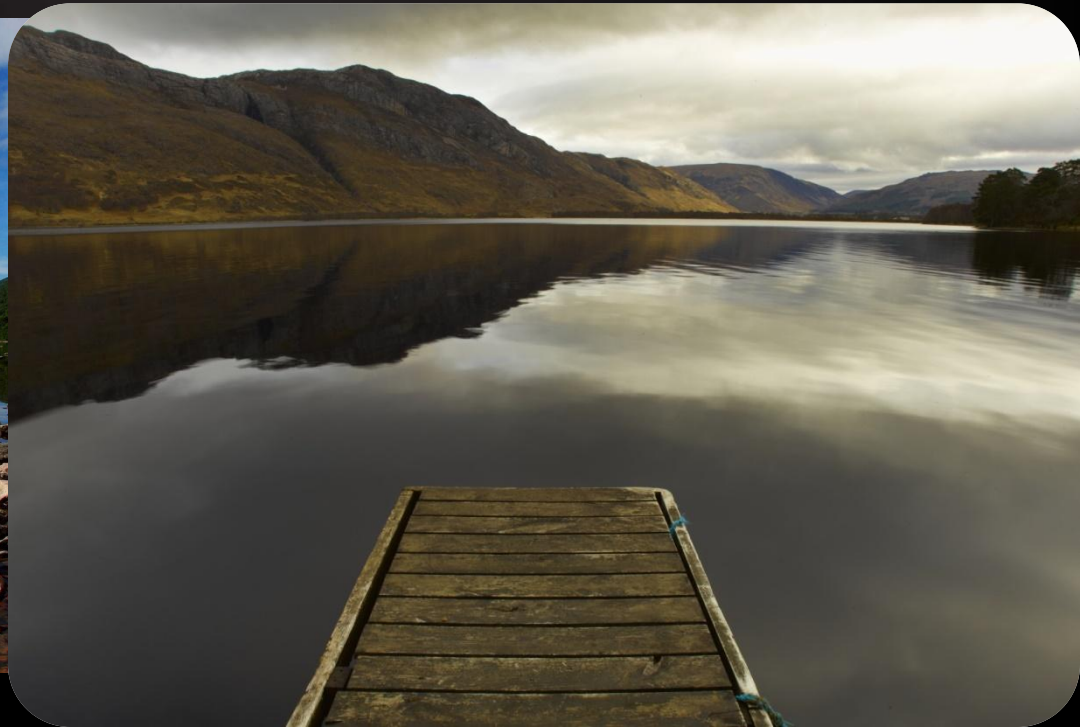
Madame Tussaud's
