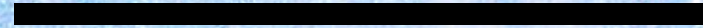

The Investiture of Prince of Wales

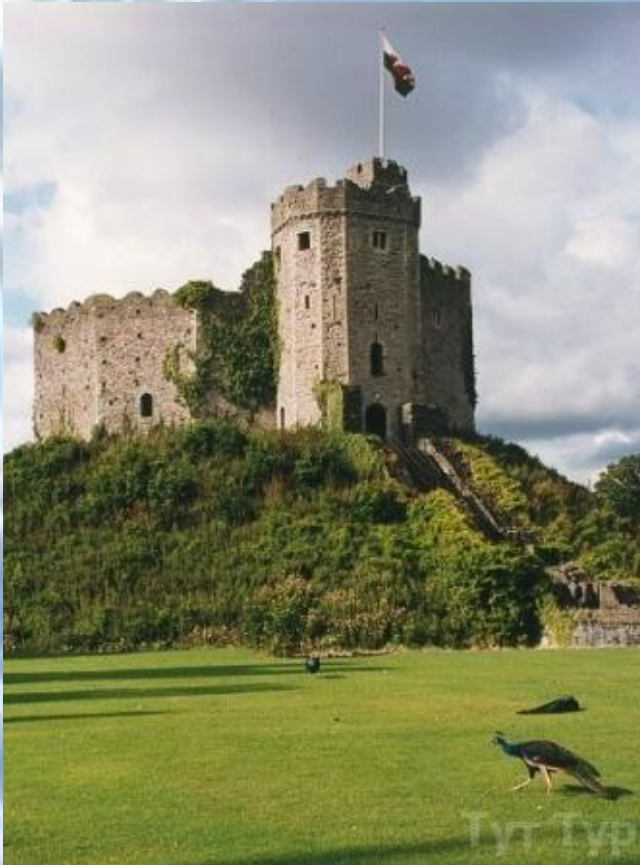


- The Investiture of Prince of Wales is the ceremony making the formal creation of the title of Prince of Wales, similar to a coronation.
