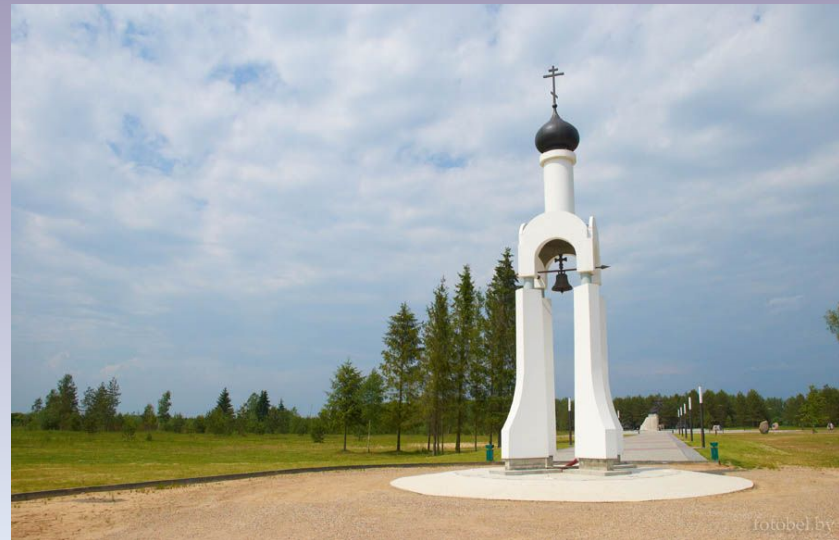


The memorials

The India Gate is a memorial to 70,000 soldiers of the Indian Army who died in the period 1914 – 1921 in the First World War, in France, Flanders, Mesopotamia, Persia, East Africa, Gallipoli and elsewhere in the Near and the Far East.

13,300 servicemen's names, including some soldiers and officers from the United Kingdom, are inscribed on the gate.

Memorial to the Missing

is a war memorial in Ypres, Belgium, dedicated to the British and Commonwealth soldiers who were killed in the Ypres Salient of World War I and whose graves are unknown.

The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier is a monument in Warsaw, Poland, dedicated to the unknown soldiers who have given their lives for Poland.

It is one of many such national tombs of unknowns that were erected after World War I, and the most important such monument in Poland.





Monument to the heroes of World War I is a monument, erected in the city of Kaliningrad in the year of the century since the beginning of world war I. It dedicated to the memory of Russian soldiers and officers, who fell in the battles of the war.



The Tannenberg Memorial was a monument to the German soldiers of the second Battle of Tannenberg in 1914 which was named after the medieval battle of the same name.

The victorious German commander, Generalfeldmarschall Paul von Hindenburg, became a national hero, and was later elected Reichspräsident.





Monument to heroes of the First World War

is one of the monuments in the city of Rostov-on-Don, dedicated to the soldiers and officers of the Russian Imperial Army who fought in the First World War.

It was erected in 2014 and is situated in the public square. 2014 was the year of a century anniversary since the start of the First World War, the war in which Russian Empire actively participated on the Eastern Front.



The Canadian National Vimy Memorial is a war memorial site in France dedicated to the memory of Canadian Expeditionary Force members killed during the First World War.

It also serves as the place of commemoration for Canadian soldiers of the First World War killed or presumed dead in France who have no known grave.



Military cemetery in Tutrakan

is war memorial, is one of the hundred national tourist sites in Bulgaria.

The memorial is dedicated to soldiers who died in the battle of Tutrakan world war I. This battle took place in September 1916 in Tutrakan and claimed the lives of about 8,000 people.

On the territory of the memorial are the remains of soldiers who died in battle, and built an Orthodox Church.
