

The Nature of Kazakhstan


- Over six thousand kinds of plants are growing in Kazakhstan
- 515 of them grow in Kazakhstan only
- Tulips are believed to first grow on the land of modern Kazakhstan
- Some of them are rare Galanthus





Fauna of Kazakhstan


- 500 kinds of birds
- 178 kinds of animals
- 12 kinds of amphibians
- and in the rivers and lakes 107 kinds of fishes
- A lot of them are in the Red Book of rare species – Snow leopard, Saiga antelope, Steppe eagle, mountain sheep, sand cat, Palas's cat and many more













