




Labelling a diagram with numbered parts

USEFUL Listening Tips

- 1. Predict topic and questions
- 2. READ THE INSTRUCTIONS
- 3. Use a minute to look through each section
- 4. Careful with question order
- 5. Look at two questions at once
- 6. Move on if you miss an answer
- 7. Watch others if you're completely lost
- 8. Look out for paraphrasing
- 9. Ignore words you don't know
- 10. Use British or American spelling & upper or lower case letters
- 11. Don't worry about what you write on the exam sheet
- 12. Careful with what you write down
- 13. GET USED TO ACCENTS
