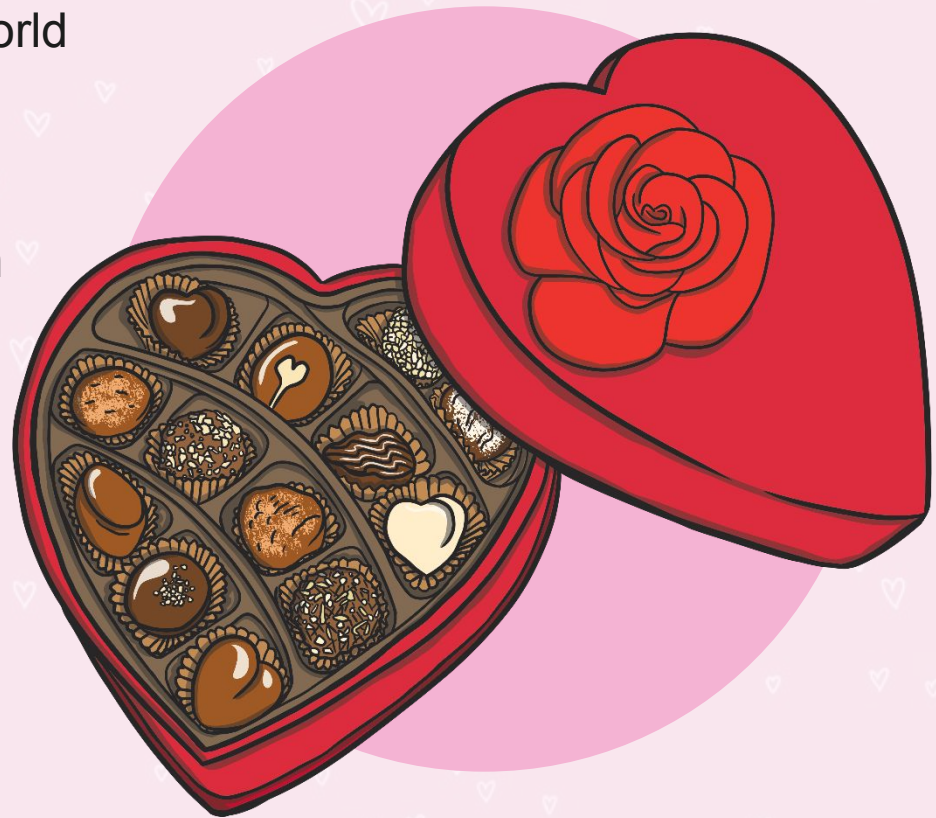

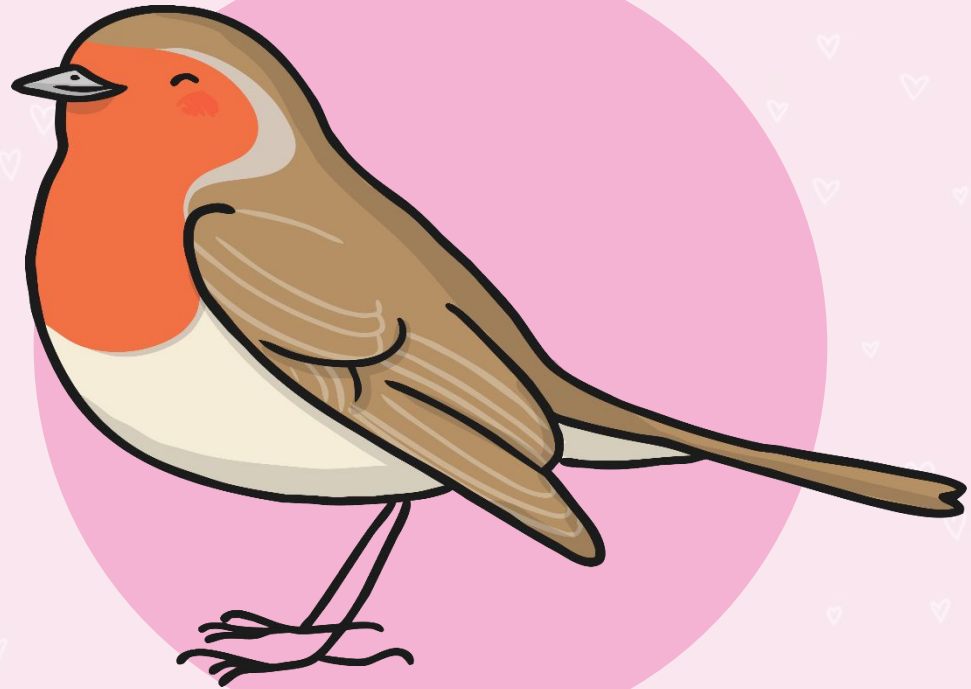
# Valentine's Day Superstitions

On Valentine's Day, the first name you read in the paper or hear on the TV or radio is the name of the person you will marry.

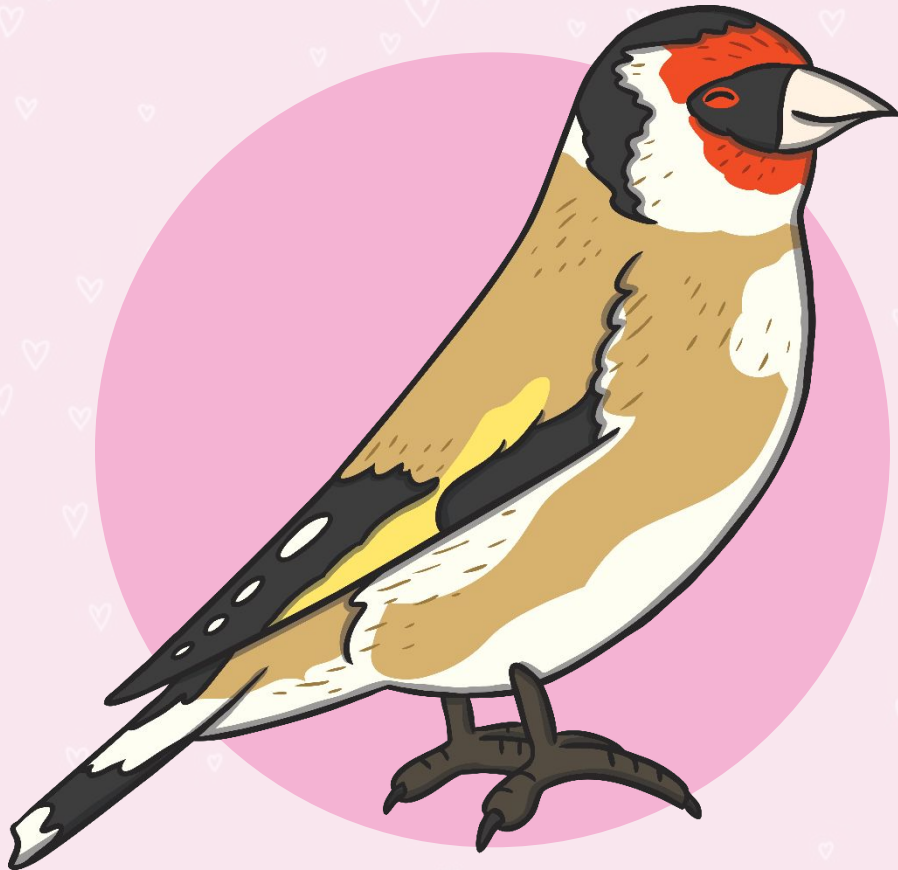


# Valentine's Day Superstitions

you will marry a sailor.

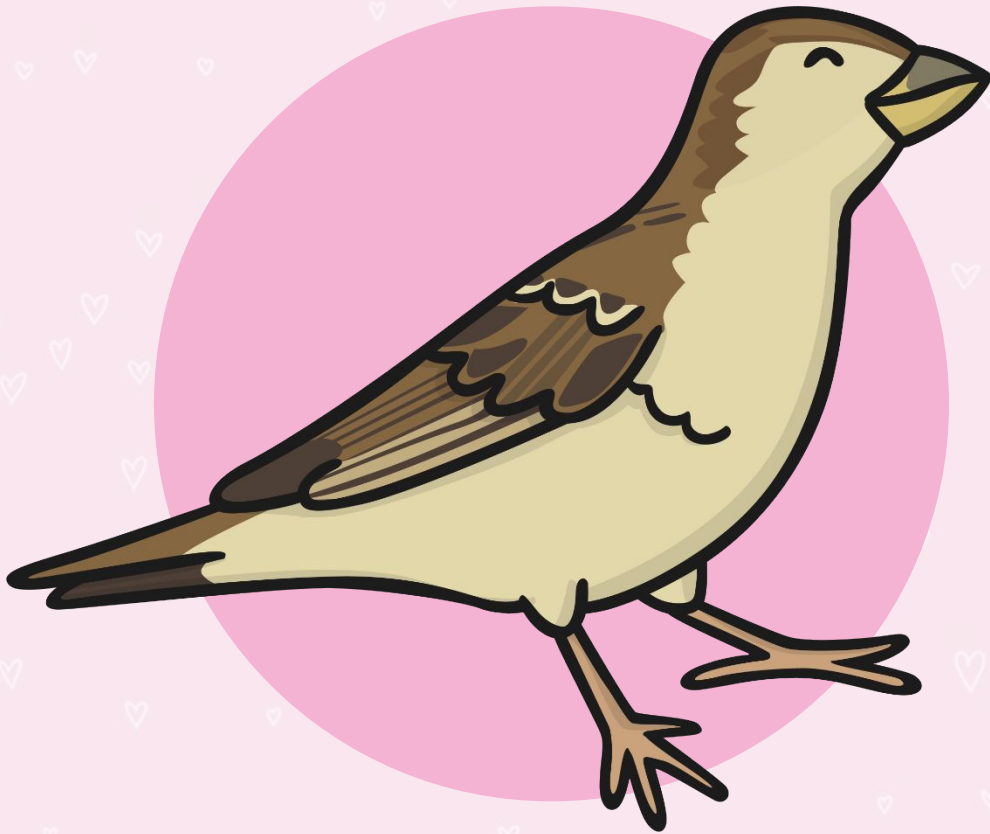


# Valentine's Day Superstitions

If you see a sparrow on Valentine's Day you will marry a poor man.

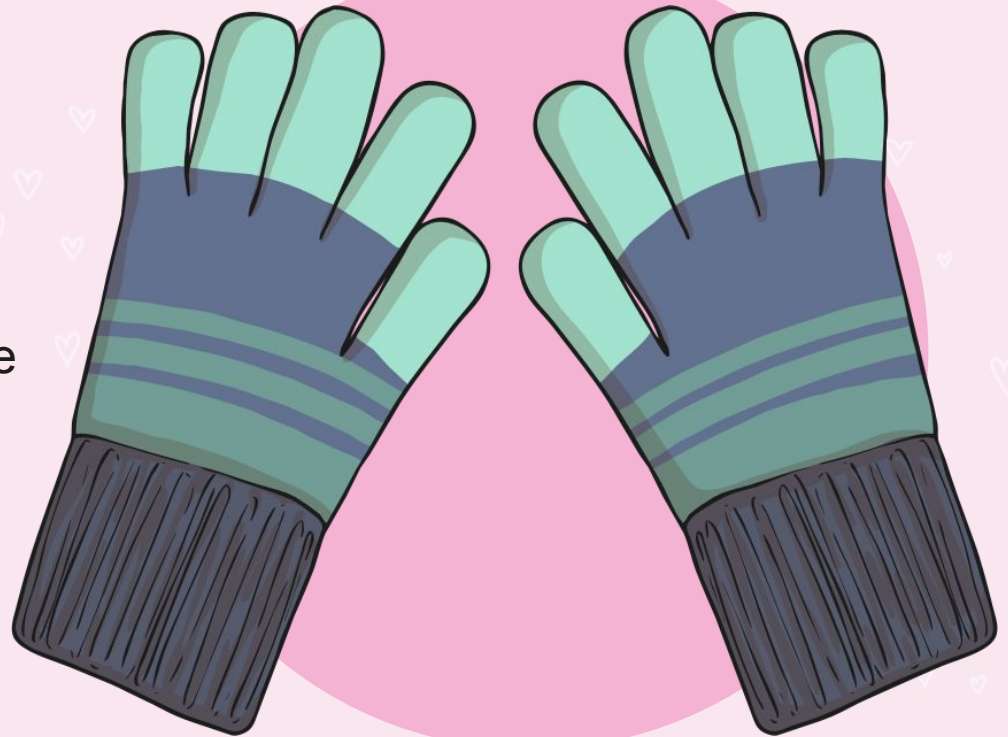
# Valentine's Day Superstitions

If you see a flock of doves on Valentine's Day, you will have a happy, peaceful marriage.



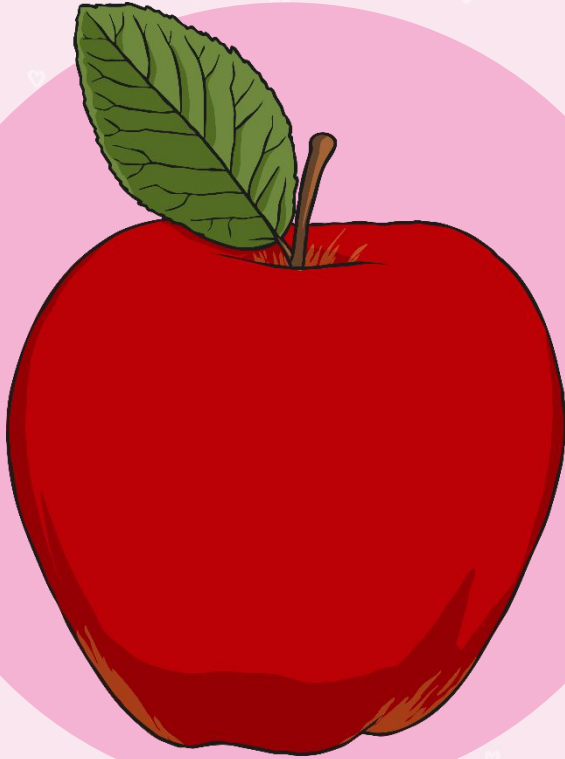
# Valentine's Day Superstitions

If you find a glove on the road on Valentine's Day, your beloved will have the other missing glove.





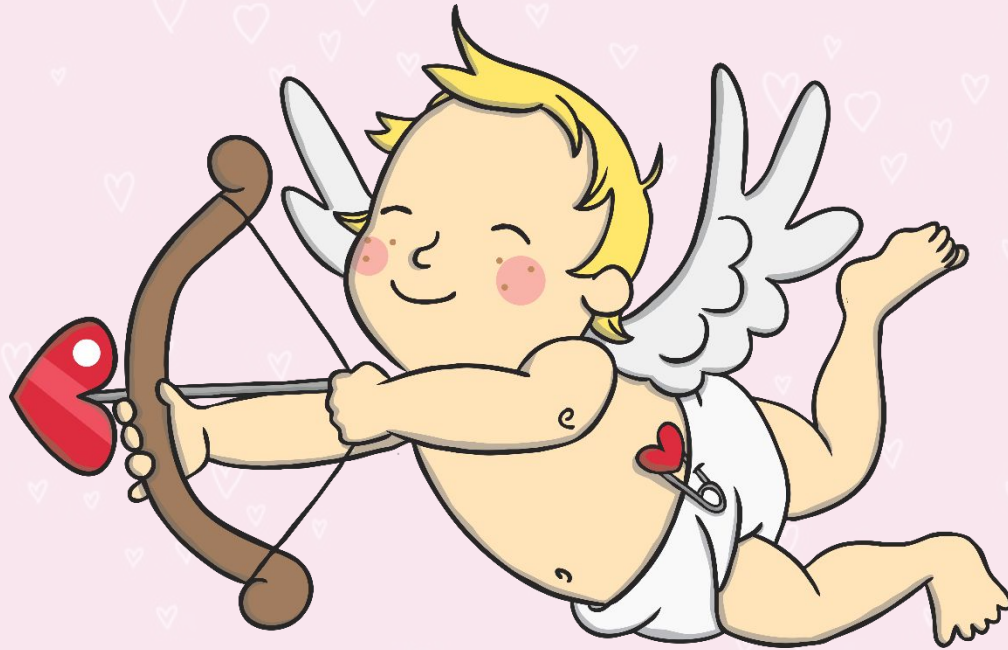
# Valentine's Day Superstitions
