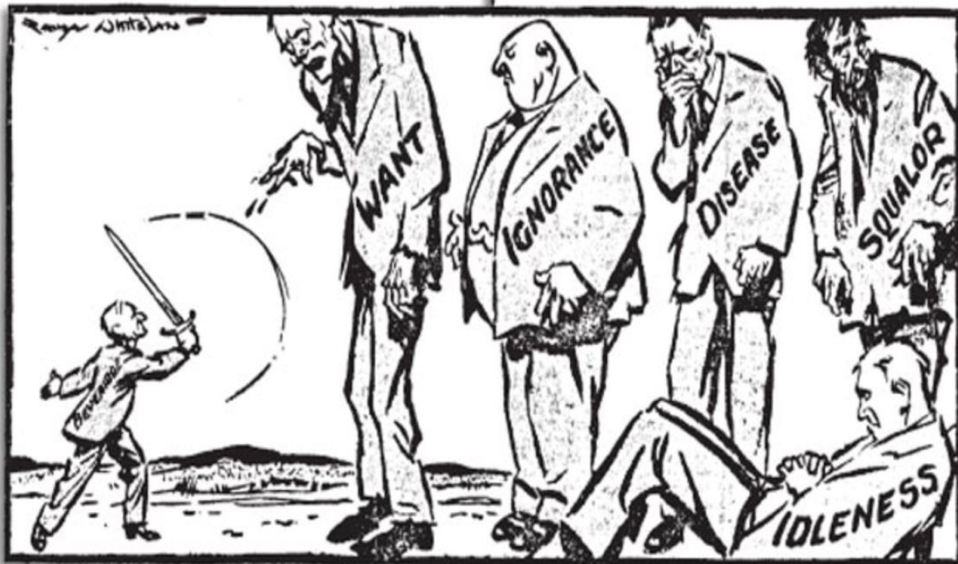

CHURCHILL, fighting as National leader, gives electors this warning:— 'GESTAPO IN BRITAIN IF SOCIALISTS WIN'

MR. CHURCHILL announced last night that he will fight the General Election as the leader of a National Government. In a gloves-off radio speech, his first of the campaign, he said:—

"I shall stand myself as a Conservative and National candidate. Others may call themselves National or Liberal National. Those who support us should vote National rather than party."

Mr. Churchill made a scathing attack on the policy of the Socialist leaders and their hunger for controls of every kind. And he gave this remarkable warning:—

"I declare it to you, from the bottom of my heart, that no Socialist system can be established without a political police. No Socialist Government conducting the entire life and industry of the country could afford to allow free or violently worded expressions of public discontent.

"They would have to fall back on some form of Gestapo—no doubt very humbly directed in the first instance. This would nip opinion in the bud.

AND NO LONGER CIVIL

"It would stop criticism as it reared its head and it would gather all the powers to the supreme party and the party leaders, using like state police where their own benevolence of civil servants, to keep the people in line."

"As for the Socialist slogan, 'Participation in the war-time effort', I have no doubt as to what it will mean to the public eye during the election campaign."

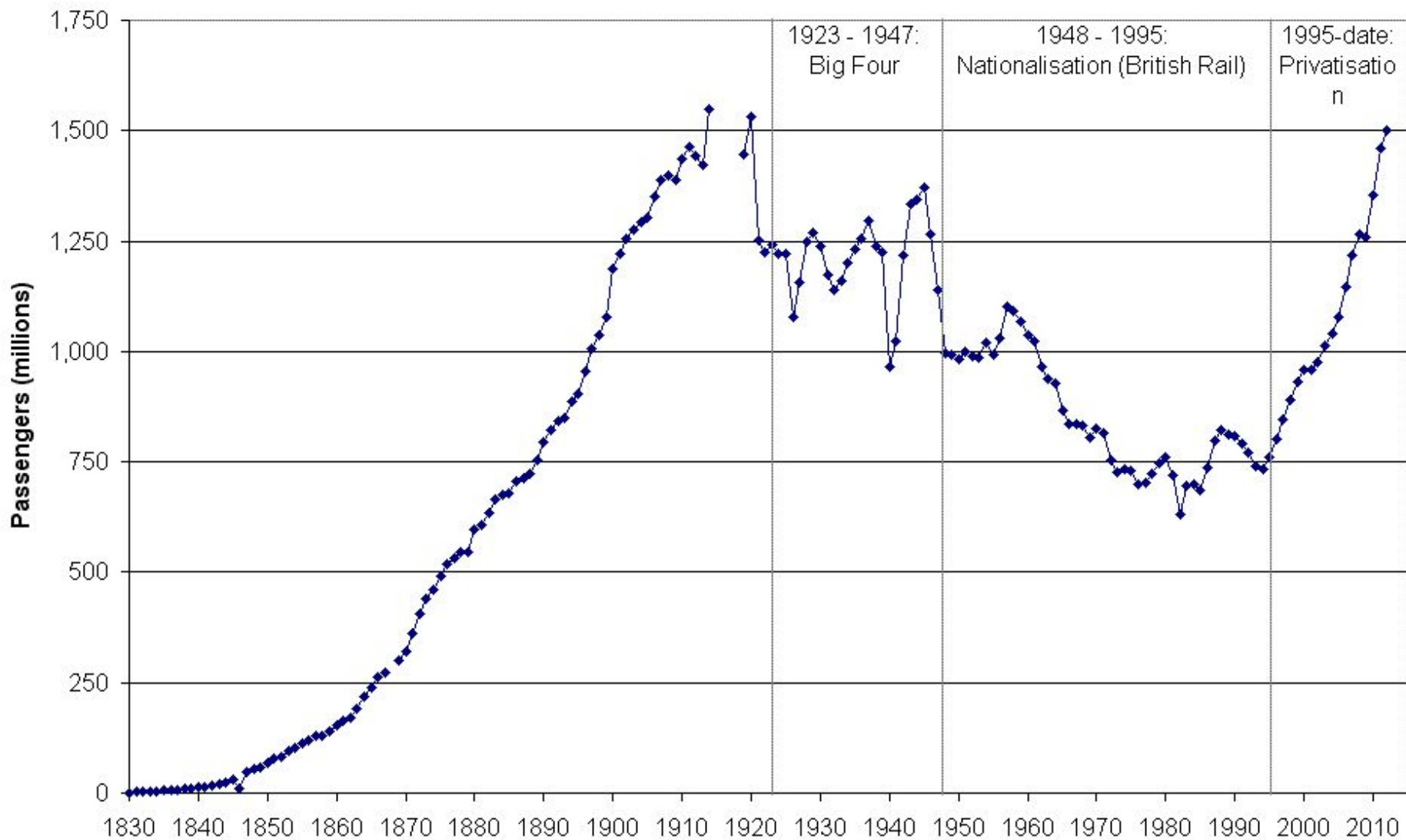

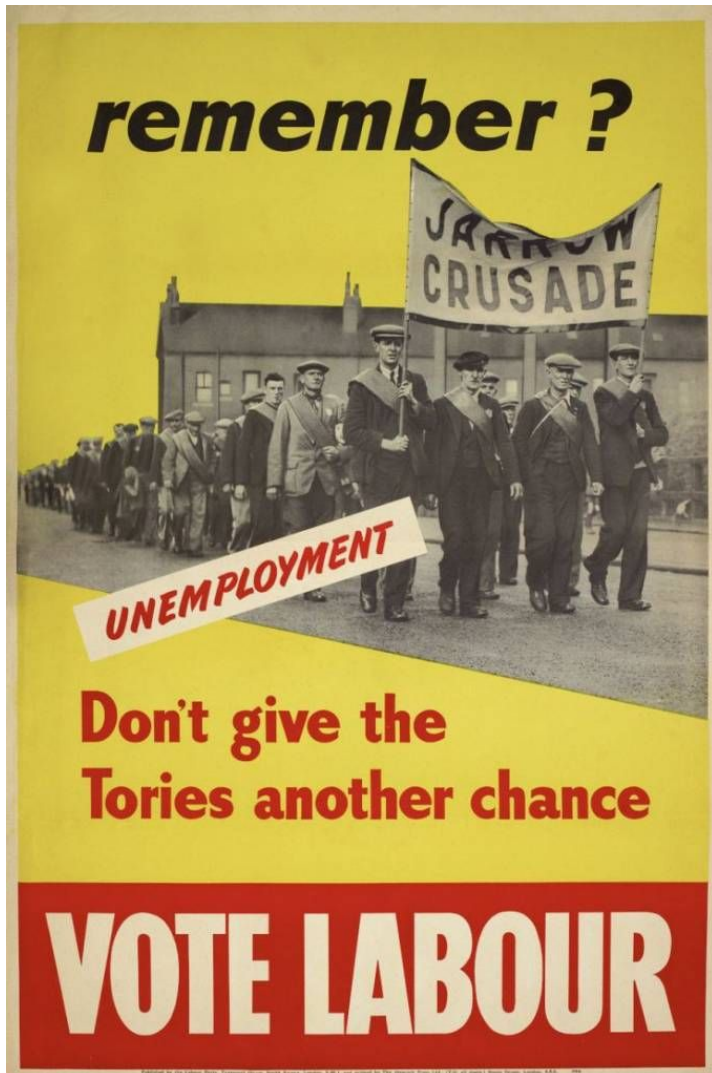
