- You might see compound nouns written in one of three ways:


One single word: rooftop


Two or more separated words: window shade


A hyphenated word: brother-in-law

A compound noun is a single noun made up of two or more words







noun + preposition/adverb/ adjective = the first element+S:

SINGULAR

- passer-by
- looker-on
- court-martial
- attorneygeneral

PLURAL

- passers-by
- lookers-on
- courts-martial
- attorneysgeneral
