# Conditional sentences (условные предложения)

# First conditional (Первый тип условных предложений)

Условные предложения 1-го типа выражают вполне <u>реальные</u>, <u>осуществимые предположения</u>, которые могут произойти <u>в будущем</u> при каком-то условии. Глагол в придаточном предложении употребляется в <u>Present Simple</u>, а в главном предложении в <u>Future Simple</u>.

If he runs, he'll get there in time.

(Если он <u>побежит</u>, он <u>доберётся</u> туда вовремя)

## Second conditional (Второй тип условных предложений)

Условные предложения 2-го типа выражают маловероятные предположения. Они относятся к настоящему или будущему. Глагол в придаточном предложении употребляется в Past Simple, а в главном предложении would + Infinitive Indefinite.

If I took lessons seriously, I would do tests better.

(Если бы я относился к урокам серьезно, я бы выполнял тесты лучше)

1-я форма сослагательного наклонения = Future in the Past	If Past Simple
<u>Подлежащее</u> would/could/might V	Подлежащее V2 (ed) didn't V

#### Third conditional

#### (Третий тип условных предложений)

Условные предложения 3-го типа выражают нереальность условия, относящегося к прошедшему времени, упущенную возможность осуществления данного условия. Сказуемое придаточного предложения выражается глаголом в Past Perfect, а сказуемое главного предложения should или would + Perfect Infinitive. Второй и третий тип переводятся глаголом в прошедшем времени в сочетании с частицей бы:

If I had seen you yesterday, I would have given you the book. (Если бы я увидел тебя вчера, я бы дал тебе книгу)
