
Using Pretty

The Greek Islands are really pretty.






Pretty is often used to mean that something is nice to look at.

This storm looks **very** bad.


Pretty can also be used to mean fairly (somewhat).

She is **fairly** flexible, but she does expect to have our work in on-time.


