(based on evidence; on what you see now)

Sue and I have decided to have a party.

We're going to invite lots of people.

COMPARE:

- "Gary phoned while you were out." "OK,
- I'll call him back."
 - "Gary phoned while you were out." "Yes, I know.
- I'm going to call him back."
- Ann is in hospital." "Oh really? I didn't know,
- I'll go and visit her."
 - "Ann is in hospital." "Yes, I know.
- I'm going to visit her this evening."

- She is going to travel
- She isn't going to travel
- ? Is she going to travel?
 - Yes, she is
 - No, she isn't

Sometimes there is not much difference between **will** and **going to**. For example, you can say:

- I think the weather will be nice this afternoon.
- I think the weather is going to be nice this afternoon.
