

Last month Brian was in the hospital for an operation. Liz didn't know this, so she didn't go to see him. They met a few days ago. Liz said:

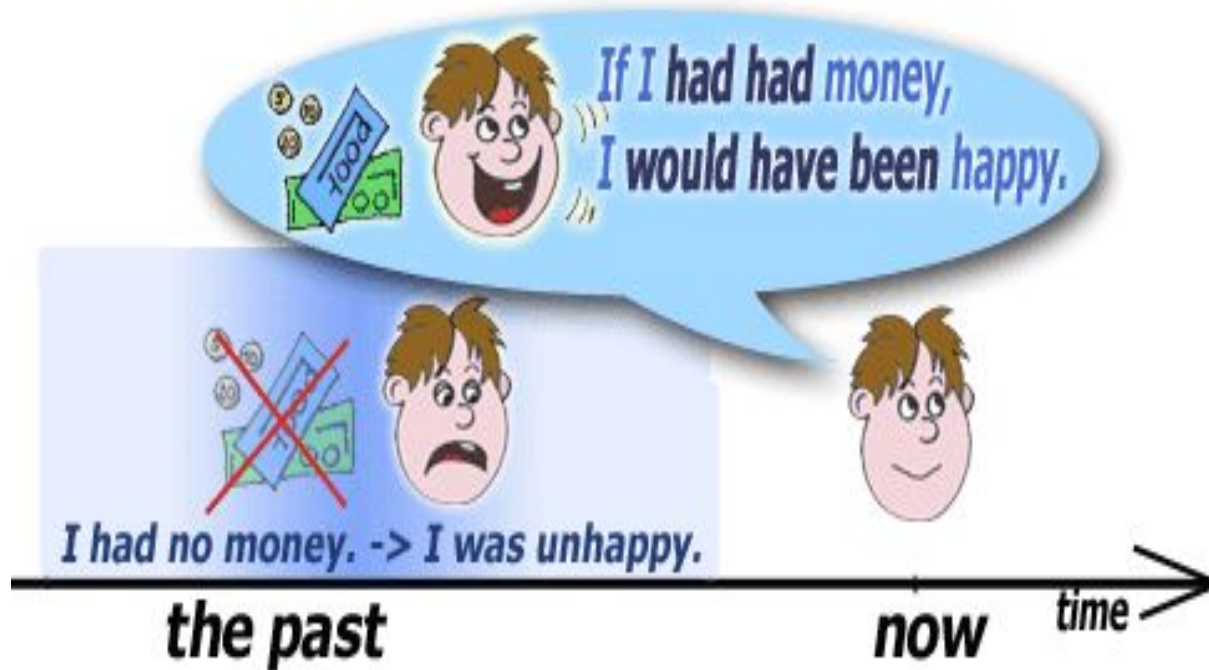
If I had known you were in the hospital, **I would have gone** to see you.

Third Conditional

- To express unreal or hypothetical situations.

for example:



- We mustn't use **would or wouldn't** in the **if** part of the sentence.

For example:

If you hadn't been late,
we **wouldn't have missed** the train.



Structure:

IF + had + verb participle, **WOULD** +
have + participle

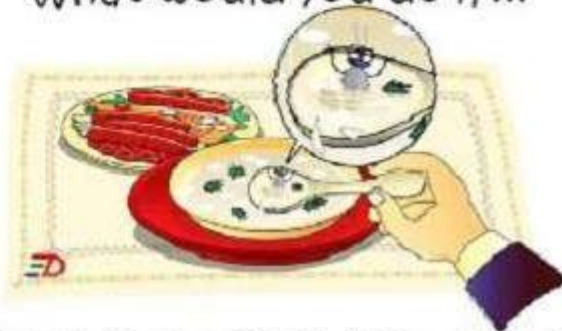
