


There are many legends and myths associated with this building. The most famous tells of the wife of a farmer who was forced to work at a construction site. When she heard that her husband died while working, she wept so bitterly at the wall that it collapsed, exposing his bones. And the woman was able to bury them. There is even a monument commemorating this event.

In 1987, the Great Wall of China entered the list of great national and historical sites of the world by UNESCO.
