# The Past Simple Tense

### How to Form the Past Simple Tense

The Past Simple tense uses for most verbs the base form of the verb (V1) with the addition of - ed. This form is called V2.

The formula: V2 = V1 + ed.

An example: V1 = work: He worked. They worked.

There are many irregular verbs in English. They have irregular past tense forms which must be memorized.

An example: V1 = go: He went. They went.

# Positive Forms of the Past Simple Tense

Singular		Plural	
1 <sup>st</sup> person	I worked/went	1 <sup>st</sup> person	we worked/went
2 <sup>nd</sup> person	you work <mark>ed/went</mark>	2 <sup>nd</sup> person	you worked/went
3 <sup>rd</sup> person he/she/it worked/went		3 <sup>rd</sup> person	they worked/went

### When to Use the Past Simple Tense

1. Completed action in the past.

An example: My friend attended a very interesting lecture yesterday.

2. Habitual/repeated occurrences in the past.

An example: I went to movies every Sunday when I was a child.

3. Something that took place for a certain period of time in the past.

An example: My friends lived in the US for fifteen years.

## Signal Words for the Past Simple Tense

yesterday
last week/month/year
a week/month/year ago
in 2000/2010/2015

#### Negative Forms of the Past Simple Tense

The formula: Subject + did not + V1 (+ object).

Examples: This engineer did not submit his project on time.

These engineers did not begin to work on their project on Monday.

The contracted form: did not = didn't

#### Question Forms of the Past Simple Tense

The formula: Did + subject + V1 (+ object)?

Did this engineer submit his project on time?

Did these engineers begin to work on their project on Monday?
