

CONDITIONALS

	If clause (condition)	main clause (result)
ZERO CONDITIONAL Used for present, real/factual situations	If I <u>drink</u> coffee at night, (If + present tense)	I <u>don't sleep</u> well. (present tense)
FIRST CONDITIONAL Used for future, real/factual situations	If I <u>drink</u> coffee tonight, (If + present tense)	l <u>won't sleep</u> well. (present tense)
SECOND CONDITIONAL Used for present or future unreal, imaginary situations	If I <u>drank</u> coffee tonight, (If + past tense)	I <u>wouldn't sleep</u> well. (would, could, might + base form of verb)
THIRD CONDITIONAL Used for past unreal, imaginary situations	If I had drunk coffee last night, (If + past perfect)	I <u>wouldn't have slept</u> well. (would have, could have, might have + past participle)


