Beautiful clothes, expensive restaurants, all-night parties, holidays in the Caribbean. This is the glamorous life of a film actor. Or is it? We talk to Sam Dane, star of Good Times, Bad Times, about his daily routine.

- Q Sam, tell us about your life as a film actor.
- A Well, a typical film is about three months' work. We work very long days and a lot of the actors live in a hotel, not at home.
- Q What time do you get up?
- A I get up at five o'clock in the morning. The people from the studio phone us then.



- Q You get up very early!
- A Yes and I'm not a morning person, so it's always difficult! We leave the hotel at 5.15 and I get to the studio at about 5.30. That's when I have my first coffee of the day. Then we start work at about 5.45.
- Q What about breakfast?
- A We have breakfast at the studio at about 7.30. But that's only for half an hour.
- Q And lunch?
- A We have lunch at twelve and we start work again at about one o'clock.
