



# QUESTION TAGS



**A tag question is a special construction in English. It is a statement followed by a mini-question. The whole sentence is a "tag question", and the mini-question at the end is called a "question tag".**

We use tag questions at the end of statements to ask for confirmation.

They mean something like: "Am I right?" or "Do you agree?"

They are very common in English.

The basic structure is:

<b>+</b> <b>Positive statement,</b>	<b>-</b> <b>negative tag?</b>
Snow is white,	isn't it?

<b>-</b> <b>Negative statement,</b>	<b>+</b> <b>positive tag?</b>
You don't like me,	do you?
