IN SHORT MESSAGES WE DON'T USUALLY WRITE:

- Greetings and polite expression like *Hi*, *I hope you're well*
- Unimportant information
- We often leave out:
- Pronouns like I, you, my I hope you can come.
- Auxiliary verbs like do, have at the start of the sentences. Do you fancy ..?
- The definite article (the) *The play starts...*
- We often use the Imperative in short notes. *Phone if you can't come*.
- We must write the important details of the message like the place and the time of the meeting.


