
## KANSAS



Kansas became the 34th state on January 29, 1861. In that year the capital was located in Topeka by popular election.



Kansas is one of the main producers of wheat and other grains in the USA. It also ranks highly in oil and natural gas production.

- 1) The old Fort Leavenworth (which was built in 1827) has an important spot in American history due to its role as a key supply base in the settlement of the Old West.
- 2) Leavenworth was founded in 1854, making it the first incorporated city in the newly formed Kansas.



Atchison has held an important part of history through its involvement in the Civil War and industrialization period.



The "Town Too Tough To Die" was founded in 1869 and, despite losing their post office in 1976, is still home to 80-some

residents.




After the failed attempt to create a town at the junction of the Little Blue and Big Blue rivers, several families from New York moved in and had the town incorporated in 1872 as a city of third class under the statutes of Kansas.



Neodesha, which comes from the Osage Indian word meaning "meeting of the waters," was originally established as a trading post in 1867. It was later incorporated in 1871.
