
Modal Auxillary Verbs (Modals)

What are Modal Verbs?

Modals are special **helping verbs**. They are used with other verbs to express things that have not actually happened.

- Modals are used to show ability, possibility, or necessity.
- Modals are also used to ask for permission or to offer a suggestion.

What are Modal Verbs?

Common modals include

- may/might
- can/could
- shall/should
- will/would
- must



What are Modal Verbs?



- ABILITYI could spend all my money in this
candy store.
- **POSSIBILITY** Kasper *might* go on an adventure in the jungle.
- **NECESSITY** Gina *must finish* her chores before company arrives.
- **PERMISSION** May I borrow a pencil?
- SUGGESTIOVicki should rest because she hasNa cold.
- **REQUEST** *Would* you *help* me wash the dishes?

Can versus May

May refers to permission.

Can refers to ability.

"Can I sharpen my pencil, Mrs. Mashburn?"

"I don't know, can you?"



"May I sharpen my pencil, Mrs. Mashburn?"

"Yes, you may!"
